Dear Brother Knights

For Christians, the Resurrection is the KEY event in the Story of God's redeeming love for his Creation!

In 1931 the Priest-Physicist Fr. Georges Lemaitre proposed what he called "the hypothesis of the primeval atom" which later scientists dubbed the "Big Bang" – a theory which can be readily integrated into the Creation story has we have it in *Genesis* – "In the Beginning. . ."

- According to this theory, in part, we are experiencing an ever-expanding Universe, powered by that original "Big Bang"! (see the article in the April issue of *Columbia*!)
- The testimony of Scripture and our Faith is that the Beginning "is" because of God, and that sustaining energy of the Universe is God's continuing action!
- Consider the Resurrection of our Lord as the "Second Big Bang" the re-birth of the Universe at the spiritual level of existence! The Resurrection begins in God's descent into absolute nothingness ("He descended into hell") and there begins the New Creation.
- In the *Letter to the Romans*, St. Paul describes Christ as the "New Adam" He is the fresh beginning of the human race, the new start for God's Creation!
- As the power of the Resurrection begins to be experienced in our lives, we begin, more and more, to live in that "newness"!
- Perhaps another way of describing this new way of living in God's New Creation is: Charity.
- It is not only the physical buildings called "churches" which are witnesses to the reality of the Resurrection after all, *if* Christ did not rise, why would there be church buildings, as there would be no Church? Our lives, too, are a continuing, tangible witness to the Resurrection and its transformative power for life!
- Think of all of the activities the expressions of Charity which our Order does on a regular basis almost as 'second nature' or, better, a 'NEW nature'!
- We are witnesses to the "Second Big Bang"! We are living in the power, the tremendous energy, released in the Resurrection of Christ, and our lives as individual Knights and as an Order give powerful witness to the truth of Christ's Resurrection!
- During this beautiful Season of Easter of 7 weeks and culminating in the celebration of the First (and continuing) Outpouring of God's Spirit Pentecost let us, Brother Knights, seek to live in and bear witness to the New Creation, of which we are part in all that we do and dare and dream!



Brothers All,

Planning for the 2023 AZ Rosary Celebration is in full swing. Meetings for the Tucson and Phoenix events evet, in particular have begun. This year we will honor Mary under her title of Our Lady of Mt Carmel. The dates are October 14 in Tucson and October 15 in Phoenix. This annual event draws thousands of the Faithful to honor Mary in Arizona venues as well as around the world through the internet. The program is sponsored by the Arizona Knights of Columbus and is solely supported through ads in the Annual Program Book and donations. We ask Knights of Columbus councils and assemblies in particular to sponsor ads in the Program Book. The response is not always good. Make an effort now to have your council or assembly represented in the Program Book and also make a concerted effort to have representatives at the various venues.



Our Lady of Mount Carmel, or Virgin of Carmel, is the title given to the Blessed Virgin Mary in her role as patroness of the Carmelite Order, particularly within the Catholic Church. The first Carmelites were Christian hermits living on Mount Carmel in the Holy Land during the late 12th and early to mid-13th century. They built in their hermitages a chapel which they dedicated to the Blessed Virgin, whom they conceived of in chivalric terms as the "Lady of the Place." Our Lady of Mount Carmel was adopted in the 19th century as the patron saint of Chile.

Since the 15th century, popular devotion to Our Lady of Mount Carmel has centered on the Scapular of Our Lady of Mount Carmel, also known as the Brown Scapular. Traditionally, Mary is said to have given the Scapular to an early Carmelite named Simon Stock (1165–1265). The liturgical feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel is celebrated on 16 July.



The Church is a home that priests and laypeople need to care for together, Pope Francis said on Saturday.

"It is time for pastors and laypeople to walk together, in every area of the Church's life, in every part of the world," he said in the Vatican's New Synod Hall on Feb. 18.

"The lay faithful are not 'guests' in the Church, they are at home, so they are called to take care of their own home," he said. "The laity, and especially women, need to be more valued in their human and spiritual skills and gifts for the life of parishes and dioceses."

Pope Francis' speech was addressed to the participants in a Feb. 16-18 conference on how pastors and laypeople can work together better for the mission of the Church.

"Together with pastors, they must bear Christian witness in secular environments: the world of work, culture, politics, art, social communication," the pope said. "We could say: laypeople and pastors together in the Church, laypeople and pastors together in the world."

Francis went on to list some of the many ways laypeople can participate in the life of the Church: performing some forms of preaching; collaborating with priests in the formation of children, young adults, seminarians, and religious novices; spiritual directing, preparing engaged couples for marriage, and accompanying married couples.

"They should always be consulted when preparing new pastoral initiatives at every level: local, national, and universal," he said.

"This is why," Pope Francis said, "pastors need to be trained from seminary days onward in daily and ordinary collaboration with the laity, so that living communion becomes a natural way of acting for them, and not an extraordinary and occasional occurrence."

"One of the worst things that happens in a pastor is to forget the people from whom he came, the lack of memory," he continued. "To him can be addressed that much-repeated word of the Bible, 'Remember;' 'remember from whence you were taken, of the flock from which you were taken to return to serve it, remember your roots' (cf. 2 Tim. 1)."

- · Councils regularly pray rosaries at visitations. Assemblies are authorized to conduct guards for 4th Degree Knights upon request.

Brother Knights,

As Knights of Columbus we value Life from conception to natural death. Through the Ultrasound program, we save lives by bringing awareness to the life growing in the mother's womb preventing abortions. Through our ASAP program, we provide much needed resources to the pregnancy centers across our state which in turn help the moms to provide for the infants. Through prayer, we fight the dark forces that try to influence a mother to kill or abandon her baby. This month I want to bring awareness to Arizona's Safe Haven Law.

The law was passed in 2001 and states that "a person will not face criminal charges for leaving an unharmed newborn baby with a Safe Haven provider, including hospitals, fire stations, on-duty firefighters or emergency medical technicians, and designated private welfare agencies, adoption agencies and churches."

Drop off drawers can be found here: Banner Thunderbird Medical Center, Banner Cardon Children's Medical Center, Banner Estrella Medical Center, HonorHealth Scottsdale Osborn Medical Center, Maricopa Medical Center, Mayo Clinic Phoenix.

The baby can be handed to a person or may be placed in the Safe Haven drawer at the above locations.

Alternatively, one can call the hotline 24/7 at Arizona Safe Baby Haven Foundation, 866-707-2229.

Newborn abandonment has been a continuing problem in our society. The Safe Haven Law was adopted to give new mothers an option that can save their baby's life and give them a solid future. Please spread the word. We do not want babies to be aborted, thrown away in the garbage or abandoned in alleys. Their life must be valued, respected, and protected.

Dear Brother Knights

This year we celebrate the 74th Anniversary of the founding of St. Joseph's Youth Camp by the Arizona Knights of Columbus. Thanks to the generous support of the Knights many children from around the state have been sponsored to go to camp.

This year the spots at camp are filling up and we would like to encourage all councils to notify us and register any campers that they plan to sponsor. Don't wait until the last minute!

This year we are asking for your help with two initiatives:

- 1. St. Joe's Clothing Drive: over the years we have had increasing need of clothing, shoes, sleeping bags, and toiletries for children that come from homeless shelters, or families that are financially unable to send their children to camp with adequate supplies. Our director and staff have driven to Flagstaff and purchased these supplies (with their own money) for the children so they could have a great experience at camp. We need your help to fill this need. Please see the list below and make a donation to St. Joseph's Youth Camp at the convention.
 - Childrens (age 7 12 boys and girls) clothing
 - Tennis shoes and socks
 - Shorts, Jeans, T-shirts, Sweatshirts
 - Toiletries: Toothbrushes, toothpaste, deodorant, soap, shampoo
 - New (in package) underwear will be accepted. Otherwise, gently
 - used articles of clothing will gladly be accepted.
- 2. Every year St. Joe's receives many requests for financial aid to send children to camp. If you cannot identify a child that your council can sponsor, we have a list of children that are in need of assistance to come to camp. We are asking for the support from councils, and assemblies, as well as individual knights to help us send these kids to camp. To facilitate this, we have established the following support levels that will be recognized at the state convention.

Bronze Council: \$200 donation provides a partial camper registration

Silver Council: \$800 donation provides 1 full camper registration



The Arizona Knights of Columbus announced a renewed vigor for defending life at this year's organization meeting.

In honor of the Supreme Court's overturning of Roe vs. Wade and the Knights of Columbus' firm stand for the protection and support of all life from conception to natural death, State Deputy Luigi Baratta announced the creation of a new pin which represents Knights kneeling in prayer. The knight's sword represents the rosary, his shield represents Knights in unity, the baby's feet on the shield represents life, and the white background represents the innocents which Knights will always defend.

"Last year, our state theme was Defender of the Faith," he explained. "This year it is Protector of Life. As Catholics, we must remain steadfast and do all we can to protect life from conception through natural death. We need to encourage men to join us to step into the breach, pray vigilantly, and assist our efforts to help serve our parishes and communities across the great state of Arizona."

In addition to their continued fundraising efforts to help purchase ultrasound machines, the Knights of Columbus have launched a new initiative called the Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP). This new initiative significantly enhances the Knights' support for mothers and children and is "a call to action for Knights across the United States and Canada to increase financial support to pregnancy resource centers, maternity homes and other organizations which give direct assistance to new mothers and/or babies."
