Greetings, Brothers All!

I have a few reminders for you:

- You received your State Per Capita First Half statement in Mid-August. It was emailed to the Financial Secretary of record with Supreme and to the Grand Knight. If you are the former holder of these roles, and receive the email, please forward it to your successor. State Per capita is how the State Council's work is funded. Please pay this bill promptly. The assessment is \$5.50 per billable member per half. Inactive members are \$2.25 per half. Honorary Life and Disabled members are not charged. Disabled members must be defined through Form 1831 with Supreme. Billing is based on Council Membership on record at Supreme as of July 1.
- Thank you to all the councils that have submitted their payments!
- A reminder notice was emailed in the recent days to Grand Knight and Financial Secretary of those councils that have not yet paid. The early-pay rebate is no longer available.
- Per Capita payments do not require a council vote.
- If you have not done so, make sure you deposit your council Per Diem check from the State Convention. Checks older than 6 months will be voided.
- Also, please make sure you have given your Charity Raffle Checks to your chosen Charities. Encourage them to deposit them as soon as possible and remind them that checks older than 6 months will be voided. Each year a few checks are never cashed. Let's make sure our Charities get the funds they deserve.

We're well into the Fraternal Year now, and I'm sure your councils are busy doing the work of the Order. We're excited to show Arizona that our Faith can truly Transform our Culture.

With the November 5, 2024 election fast approaching there are many decisions to be made. Catholics in Arizona are fortunate to have 3 Bishops that bonded together as one voice as a guide on some of the most important propositions on the ballot. As Knights we support our Bishops as well as follow the guidance from the Supreme Council. By following the guidance below, we will support life from conception to natural death and give all people the dignity they deserve.

- 1. Remember to vote in November!
- 2. Remember to form your consciences, keeping in mind the statement of our bishops that, "The threat of abortion remains our pre-eminent priority because it directly attacks our most vulnerable and voiceless brothers and sisters and destroys more than a million lives per year in our country alone." - 3. Remind also to consider the teaching of the Bishops of Arizona (Link: https://azcatholicconference.org/category/colums-and-statements/)

By following the guidance above, Knights will be in alignment with Officers Desk Reference which does not allow the Knights to take a position on a specific proposition. Although any member of the Knights of Columbus is free to express his opinion on matters of public concern (such as proposed legislation, judicial decisions, public controversies, judicial nominations, ballot initiatives, and elections), he may not identify himself as a member of the Knights of Columbus when doing so. Simply put, holding a sign saying "Love Life Support Life" with the emblem of the Order on it is a great way to support the unborn and express our position in this year's election, holding a sign that says "No on Proposition 139" with the Emblem of the Order on the sign or while appearing to represent the Knights of Columbus is not allowed.

The Knights of Columbus has a long record of advocacy on pro-life issues. We have been at the forefront of the pro-life movement for over 50 years. Through The March for Life, Ultrasound Initiative, ASAP Program and many other endeavors, we stand in solidarity with the vulnerable pre-born and their mothers.

We currently have over 80 e-members that have been recruited since July 1st that have not been transferred into your councils. These men are listed on each council's Prospect Tab in Officers On-Line.

Until these members attend a C-U-F Degree and are transferred into the council, your council does not receive membership credit towards your annual goal and Star Council status!

If you need assistance in accessing your prospects, please call me and I will help you through it. If you need help hosting a C-U-F Degree, please call me, and we can make it happen!! We have 80+ men already in process. Let's get them into







our councils as quickly as possible. The sooner they join your councils, the sooner they can participate in your programs and help your councils flourish!!!!

Make plans now to host a Church Drive and C-U-F in the 2nd Quarter:

- > Schedule a Church Drive and Post It on the State Calendar
- > Host an In-Person C-U-F Degree within a week of the Church Drive
- Contact all prospects for your council and get them to attend the C-U-F
- > Transfer All New Members via Officers On-Line that day



Church Membership Drive Playbook

2-3 Weeks Prior

- Post dates of church drive on state calendar
- Run ads in church bulletin every week
- Organize teams of 6-8 brother knights for each mass
- Invite the Field Agent to help out
- Ask pastor/priests to promote the knights and encourage men to join

Day Of Event

- Greet parishioners before each mass
- Hand out K of C info to men and prayers cards to the ladies & children
- With Pastor's permission, give a 2-3 minute pulpit speech (note: have your best speaker do it, not always the GK)
- > Conclude pulpit announcement by reciting prayer on prayer card handed out (members distribute more during speech)
- Cover all exits after mass. Greet everyone but identify men that might be interested
- Funnel prospects to the "closers" on your team. Have agent code and team membership numbers available.
- Assist candidates with completing on-line membership <u>and</u> have candidate confirm while standing there
- Congratulate and welcome your new brother knight (and his family) with a smile and firm handshake!!

The Following Sunday

- Host A C-U-F Degree Ceremony immediately after the last mass of the day
- Have The Ceremony in the church, of possible
- ➤ Host a luncheon/desserts & coffee/social event immediately after ceremony ends.

This will give you a chance to meet and learn about the new member and allow him to meet and greet his new brother knights!

- Ask new brothers to introduce themselves and their families before eating
- Have FinSec hand out membership cards before new members depart

We are finding that by following this playbook (with modifications unique to each council), we are having more success at not only getting members to join, but also getting them engaged early, providing the council with an influx of active members looking for programs to participate in.

The August featured Faith program was the McGivney Holy Hour. Congratulations to Blessed Francis Council #18215, the incentive winner of the \$150 Global Wheelchair Mission donation. They along with seven other councils participated in the McGivney Holy Hour. With their win they now have two points for Faith towards their Columbian Award requirement, and two for Community, with the Global Wheelchair Mission.







Thank you to the councils who sent in their 10784s. In July a total of 192 forms were received.

Currently, I have received six 10784s for the September featured program, Food for Families. I will announce the Coats for Kids Donation winner next month. **10784!** Send them in, please. Form Invitation (kofc.org)

Upcoming Program events and deadlines: Some of these are still weeks out but you should start planning

The month of **October is Life Month.** The featured program is the Silver Rose. Any life program will suffice for those councils not participating in the SR. The incentive winner will receive a State donation of \$100 to the Ultrasound Initiative.

Soccer Challenge: The Soccer Challenge is a great way for councils to engage in their communities with an athletic event for youth that encourages the values of sportsmanship and healthy competition. Children demonstrate the most important skill in soccer – shooting accuracy on the penalty kick. Youth compete within their gender and age to progress from the local level to district, regional and







state/province competitions. For Soccer Challenge resources, visit www.kofc.org/soccer.

Councils will need to hold their competitions in early September. District Deputies, you will need to hold a District competition if you have more than one council in your district participating. The State competition will be held again in October or November.

Coats for Kids: Councils should begin discussing the organizations they would like to participate with and purchase the Coats. Keep in mind that by mid-November last year, Supreme ran out of Coats. If your council is considering a Hoodie option as a few did last year, be sure to purchase a box or two from Supreme to get the Columbian Award credit for CFK.

Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest: kofc.org/essay

Council: The council representative collects finished essays from schools and other participants. They are judged according to the criteria in the "Judging" section. Upon completion, the winning entries for each grade level (five total) should be forwarded to the next level of competition, going to either the district deputy or jurisdiction community chairman depending on the setup in your area.

District: District-level judging is only necessary if more than one council within your district participates in the Catholic Citizenship Essay Contest. Make sure your councils know the deadline so they can schedule their competition accordingly. The district deputy plus one or two other judges should score the essays on the same entry form/score sheet that was used for the council level. Winning entries should be sent to the jurisdiction office for the next level of the contest. Check with your state community chairman for the deadline and forwarding address.

District judging is required before being sent to Jeff Schnieder at the Jurisdiction level. DD's to forward the entries to him by **December 1**. Jeff Schneider, bronte8077@gmail.com

Keep Christ in Christmas Poster Contest: Last year, we received many fantastic artworks of children's representation of Christ in Christmas. Start encouraging your councils to reach out to their local schools and CCD classes to try and get this excellent program as part of the curriculum. Again, the program is open to children







from kindergarten through 8th grade. If you have any other questions, please visit kofc.org/Christmas.

Suggested Timetable:

- 1) Local Councils should order their kits in September or October to be ready to present the contest by November.
- 2) Posters should be completed by December 1, and the council judging should take place by December 31.

Additional judging deadlines are as follows:

3) District — January 15 Regional — January 31 Jurisdictional — February 15 International – State councils must submit their winning entries to the Supreme Council no later than February 28. International winners will be announced approximately March 15.

Arizona Bishops Denounce State Proposition 139 on Abortion

As Catholic Bishops of Arizona we want to express our strong opposition to Proposition 139.

If passed, this initiative threatens to enshrine a constitutional right to virtually unrestricted abortion in Arizona. What makes a constitutional amendment especially grave is that our own Arizona legislators could lose the ability to regulate abortion in any meaningful way, leaving us with the potential for what would likely become nearly unrestricted abortion.

Arizona law currently allows for abortions up until 15 weeks of pregnancy. Proposition 139, however, would go far beyond even this current law.

The proposed amendment, among other things, would likely remove most safeguards for girls and women that are currently in place at abortion clinics, permit a minor to obtain an abortion without parental involvement or permission, and allow for painful late-term abortions of viable pre-born children.

While this ballot measure claims to be moderate in nature, its vague language would make Arizona one of the most extreme states in terms of abortion. We believe that even many of those who support abortion in limited instances would find this proposed constitutional amendment extreme and misleading.

Arizonans deserve far better than the measures being proposed in this initiative which is why we strongly oppose Proposition 139.

Arizona Catholic Bishops Statement Opposing Proposition 314

As Catholic Bishops of Arizona, we express our frustration about the current situation at the US-Mexico border. The lack of a federal solution to challenges faced by both vulnerable asylum seekers and American communities is sorely needed and long overdue.

The states and local communities along the border shoulder much of the challenges created by the federal government's neglect. Its failure to address increased migration in a pragmatic and humane way has led to an ineffective response at the border and an unacceptable number of migrant deaths.

We do not question the good intentions of those seeking to address these challenges. Nonetheless, we believe that Proposition 314 will have unanticipated consequences, and that it is not the right solution.

Although proponents argue that Proposition 314 is about border security, the reality is that its passage will create real fear within Arizona communities that will have harmful consequences. In particular, by having state and local law enforcement responsible for enforcing what should be the role of federal immigration authorities, many crime victims and witnesses will be afraid to go to law enforcement and report crimes. As a result, dangerous criminals will not be apprehended, and public safety will be threatened.

Additionally, immigration by its nature is a national issue and the regulation of immigration extends beyond the purview of individual states, points consistently affirmed by the U.S. Supreme Court. Rather than holding the federal government accountable, Proposition 314 will only create further disorder and confusion, placing unworkable and unrealistic expectations on state judicial officers and law enforcement personnel.

The federal government needs to do a much better job of managing our national border and providing comprehensive immigration reform. Proposition 314, however, is unlikely to survive legal challenges and is not the right solution to these problems.
