Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI – May He Rest In Peace

In this image released on Sunday, Jan. 1, 2023, by the Vatican Media news service late Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI is laid out in state in the chapel of the monastery 'Mater Ecclesiae' where he mostly lived after retiring on Feb. 28, Benedict, the Pope German theologian who will be remembered as the first pope in 600 years to resign, has died, the Vatican announced Saturday Dec. 31, 2022. He was 95. (Vatican Media via AP)

Pope Emeritus Benedict XVI, who was known as Joseph Ratzinger before he became the church's 265th pontiff, died at 95, December 31, 2022. Nearly 10 years ago he became the first pope to step down as pontiff since 1415, which means that his passing will be the first for a pontiff not followed by a conclave in more than six centuries.

His death triggered a period of mourning for the Vatican, and his funeral to be held Thursday and will be presided over by Pope Frances and will likely be widely attended by leading and political figures.

"He's with God now, and that's what's important," said Althea Reyes, a nun from the Philippines who was in St. Peter's Square when she became aware of Benedict's death. "We have been praying for him to have a peaceful end and he did."

"He lived his life and he died with dignity and devotion," said Giancarlo Pavan, a lay employee of a nearby Catholic church and one of the leaders of a small prayer circle in the square. "This is something we should try to emulate. We cannot be surprised he has died after such a long life of service. But I think we are all poorer without him."

Benedict's funeral will be held on Thursday, Jan. 5 in St. Peter's Square, in front of the basilica. The ceremony will start at 9:30 a.m. (0830 GMT) and will be presided over by Pope Francis. Vatican spokesman Matteo Bruni said that following the wishes of Benedict, the funeral would be simple, solemn and sober.

Brothers,

Begin with the end in mind.

It is the beginning of the year. Goals are set, challenges accepted, and the year is ready to go! Except when it isn't. Goal setting should not be taken lightly. Let's say that your goal is to lose 50 pounds.

Let's break that down:

50 pounds - by when??

Easter

Summer

End of year

Let's say its summer and assume summer is June 1.

That gives you 5 months.

That's 10 pounds a month.

Which is about 2-3 pounds per week.

If you burn 500 calories extra per day, you lose 1 pound in a week.

That would mean you need to either burn an extra 1000 calories per day to get to the 2 pounds.

Just by doing nothing, you burn about 2000 calories. Let's say your food intake is 2000 calories per day.

Now let's add in walking 3 miles per day. That will get you to about 300 calories. That would mean that you need to take your intake down to 1800 per day to meet the 500 calories extra per day to lose that weight.

Whew!! That's a lot of information to drop 50 pounds!!

I'm not trying to detract you from accomplishing a goal, but goals need to be thought out and a plan put together on how to accomplish them.

Let's say your goal now is to get closer to God by December 31. How do you plan on doing that?

Well, you go to church every Sunday. Great start, but that is the norm.

Does your church offer adoration? Work in one hour per week in adoration.

How about adding in 20 minutes a day studying the Bible? The Bible in a Year podcast is a great way to do that. Jesus taught us to help those less fortunate. By doing good works, in the name of Jesus, you can accomplish thatoffering more time to help with the Knights activities, volunteering at a soup kitchen, donating goods to pregnancy resource centers, helping out St. Vincent de Paul.

You can start listening to the Catechism in a Year to learn more about what the Catholic church teaches.

You can attend the Men's Conference, a March for Life, pray in front of an abortion clinic.

Maybe it's as simple of as praying a family rosary weekly, or even better, nightly.

If you wanted to make it easier, break it down by quarters:

First Quarter – attend March for Life and Men's Conference, attend your parish Lenten mission

Second Quarter - attend Holy Thursday mass, Friday Stations of the Cross, and Feast of Corpus Christi prayer Third Quarter – host a water drive to get water to the homeless

Fourth Quarter – attend the Arizona Rosary Celebration, help feed the homeless for Thanksgiving, attend your parish Advent mission.

And on all of these activities you should keep your family in mind to help bring them closer to God also!

There are many possibilities that can lead you down that path to be closer to God. And you don't have to give up chocolate to get there!

 - b. The Tucson march is Saturday, January 21, 2023, 9:00 AM 12:00 PM, starting at St. Augustine Cathedral
 - c. The Phoenix march is Thursday February 23, 2023, 11:00 AM Rally at the Capitol and 12:00PM march.
- 5. Celebrate the worth and dignity of every human being through the Special Olympics. Councils can work with Special Olympics affiliates to determine how best to fund, sponsor or volunteer for events in the local community.
- 6. Christian Refugee Relief. Help persecuted and at-risk Christians facing genocide all over the world, particularly in the Middle East by bringing awareness and support to those who have suffered for their faith.
- 7. Mass for People with Special Needs. Welcome individuals and families who might not feel comfortable participating in a regularly scheduled Mass. Councils can sponsor a distinct Mass, conducted annually, for people with special needs.
- 8. Silver Rose. Share the message of Our Lady of Guadalupe and promote respect for life by participating in this meaningful pilgrimage.



Honorary (Honorary Life) Membership Ceremonial

If the member has been a member for 25 consecutive years and has reached age 70 or has been a member for 50 years regardless of age, the only change in the following ceremonial is to substitute the words "honorary life member" for "honorary member" wherever the latter appears.

The honor may be conferred upon one individual member or in groups of two or more. If a group, change singular to plural where necessary.

The following items should be obtained by the financial secretary prior to the ceremony. Honorary Member (#1457) and Honorary Life Member (#1458) certificates are available for a nominal charge as well as Honorary Member (#PG-109) and Honorary Life Member (#PG-110) lapel pins.

- · Keep your council and assembly informed if and when you move or need specialized care. We want to stay in touch to support and pray for you.
- \cdot Families must request our services for visitations and funerals.
- · Councils regularly pray rosaries at visitations. Assemblies are authorized to conduct guards for 4th Degree Knights upon request.
- · Tell your family what you would like your Knights Council to do in the event of your passing on to your reward. By completing the below form, you tell your family:

Dear Worthy Officers, Sir Knights and Brothers All,

When the State Deputy informed me of the appointment as District Master, the mission of the Fourth Degree was clear. First increase membership by recruiting new members into the Knights of Columbus. Second, increase the visibility of the Knights of Columbus through callouts. And finally, provide exciting state-wide programs that increase support for those who serve and have served.

The membership goal is to add 335 new Sir Knights state-wide. This goal averages to about 9 new members per assembly. Supreme has issued a new revised Form 4. All assemblies are encouraged to order the latest Form 4 and have them ready to sign up new candidates. Membership in the Fourth Degree comes from parish visibility and council membership. Fourth Degree members can make a difference by attending council meetings, support Council programs and most important recruit and attend the next CUF with your new candidate. Can we Sir Knights pledge to meet this GOAL?

This goal is the most important and yet complicated as it requires Fourth Degree Exemplifications. With the hotel costs at an all-time high and knowing the risk of not obtaining the overall attendance necessary to meet a contract requirements, the decision was made to work with local councils and assemblies for good degrees using parish facilities. The goal of four exemplifications before the end of this fraternal year is a challenge, but I am excited to say that three of the four are secured.

The next two exemplification dates are secured. January 14th at Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Tempe will be the next Fourth Degree Exemplification. The third scheduled Exemplification is February 25th in Tucson. The ONLINE Registration is being prepared with a rollout date by November 7th for the January 14th degree, and shortly after for the February 25th Degree. As for the final Exemplification to close out this fraternal year, a date and location still needs to be secured.

Thank you, Sir Knights, for the support and let's continue marching down the aisles. The biggest single improvement is timely communications starting with this District Master position.



The third goal is in my opinion the easiest to improve upon by simply increase participation. From a State Level, there are opportunities that are being pursued with a planned rollout after January 14th.

The time to recruit is now! Please let your council members know to save the date in order that they can gain the honors of the Patriotic Degree!





The Arizona Knights of Columbus announced a renewed vigor for defending life at this year's organization meeting.

In honor of the Supreme Court's overturning of Roe vs. Wade and the Knights of Columbus' firm stand for the protection and support of all life from conception to natural death, State Deputy Luigi Baratta announced the creation of a new pin which represents Knights kneeling in prayer. The knight's sword represents the rosary, his shield represents Knights in unity, the baby's feet on the shield represents life, and the white background represents the innocents which Knights will always defend.

"Last year, our state theme was Defender of the Faith," he explained. "This year it is Protector of Life. As Catholics, we must remain steadfast and do all we can to protect life from conception through natural death. We need to encourage men to join us to step into the breach, pray vigilantly, and assist our efforts to help serve our parishes and communities across the great state of Arizona."

In addition to their continued fundraising efforts to help purchase ultrasound machines, the Knights of Columbus have launched a new initiative called the Aid and Support After Pregnancy (ASAP). This new initiative significantly enhances the Knights' support for mothers and children and is "a call to action for Knights across the United States and Canada to increase financial support to pregnancy resource centers, maternity homes and other organizations which give direct assistance to new mothers and/or babies."
