He restores my sanity everyday and guides my decisions that I might honor him in all that I do.

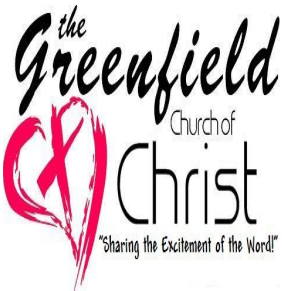

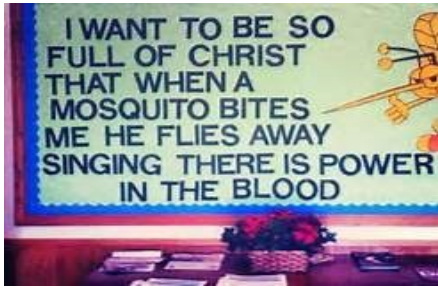
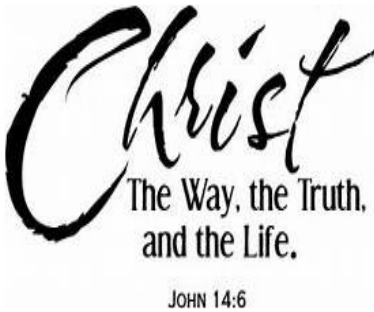
