Noah's Ark — The most terrifying detail about Noah's Ark isn't the size of the flood. It is the design of the boat. If you look closely at the blueprints God gave Noah in Genesis 6, He was extremely specific. He gave the exact length, width, and height. He specified the type of wood and the pitch to seal it. In my little years, I have never thought of this! But God left out one crucial component. There was no steering wheel, no sail, and worse still, there was no engine. Think about how scary that is. Noah was building a massive vessel to survive a global storm, but he had zero control over it, or over where it went. He couldn't steer it away from rocks. He couldn't turn it into the waves. He couldn't aim for dry land. He was completely at the mercy of the water. The Ark was not designed for navigation; just for floating. Noah's job was to be the Passenger, not the Captain. God was the Captain. This is a picture of your life right now. You are trying to put a steering wheel on a situation that God wants you to simply float through.



From David's Desk

Living the Early Church Way

It's interesting to me how much church has changed throughout the years. Growing up as a "preacher's kid", I have been in church my entire life and during my lifetime, I have seen shifts in what church looks like. When I was a kid, church was mostly for Christians, we would sing hymns accompanied by the piano and organ, the sermon was filled with sayings, phrases, or words that you would only know if you had been to church or looked at a Bible, and it was a place for Christians to be fed. Later on in my life, church changed to where it was more about bringing new people in. Gone were the services led by piano and organ and in its place were guitars and drums. The sermons were brought down to a level that you didn't have to be a scholar to understand, and the whole atmosphere seemed more like a place you visit for entertainment, rather than a place to worship. The church went away from being a place where Christians were being fed, to a place where you had the mindset of what can I do to attract more people.

What should church be about and what does God want the church to look like? On Sunday mornings, we are going to be going through the book of Acts and finding the answer to those questions. If you look at the verse below, the early church was all about being together and living life together. What would it look like in our day to live out the early church practice of "being together" constantly? Especially in a time in life where everybody seems too busy and the volunteers at church are close to burn out! Maybe it's a group of men doing lunch once a week, whoever can make it. Or young moms gathering for coffee while their kids play. I've seen groups make good use of text messages and group video chats to "check in" regularly, offering prayer and encouragement. Maybe it's a handful of students lingering over ice cream on a weekday afternoon, laughing, swapping stories, building bonds that carry gospel reminders. Neighbors opening their screened-in porch once a week for whoever from the church wants to drop by.


