The fire has already burned 200,000 acres and is expected to continue growing due to high winds and temperatures. Shelters are open in Busby and Broadus for those who have had to evacuate. There are three Central Plains congregations in the area -- Lame Deer Mennonite Church, Ashland Christian Fellowship, and White River Cheyenne Mennonite Church in Busby.
