Show Funding for 2020 Appeal

The Show committee is already exploring how to raise monies to cover the cost of the 2020 Show and hopefully into the future. We have explored several ideas. Grants tend to be given to Associations for physical equipment such as meeting huts or strimmers, it is relatively easy to demonstrate such items will provide a community with real benefits but it is harder to gain grants for Show or event expenses. The Site competition judges will be visiting site in the first two weeks of July. We will try our best to let you know when judging on your site has been completed so that entrants can start digging up their crops!

Water Challenges

As Water Plus insist in charging site for full return to sewerage charges, rather than the 25% deal with Severn Trent, Associations have had to deal with an increase in actual water costs. This is leading to challenges in paying bills, as we are at the same time, experiencing lower than average rainfall. It even more important that we conserve and use our water effectively. All plot holders need to harvest water from structures.

Many thanks go to **Bleak Hill Allotments** who passed out detailed information to their plot holders about watering regimes. The information is from The National Allotment Association so we know that it is reliable. Don't waste your water on the following crops as they do not need much and for some, watering is a waste of time and money.

Carrots - never water, it will lower the yield

Potatoes – water only when the flowers have just opened, but otherwise there should be enough moisture in the soil to sustain the plants

Parsnips – watering doesn't benefit the crop

Jerusalem artichoke - never water, otherwise you encourage the formation of leaves and not tubers

Rosemary and Thyme – woody herbs which can withstand dry seasons

Beetroot – don't over water as this will increase leaf size not root size, but don't allow the soil to dry out completely

Brussels sprouts – established plants will only require watering during exceptionally dry weather

Kohlrabi – the root system of this is plant is well developed for sourcing water and so can withstand very dry seasons

Onions – after the plant has been established, they require little watering and never after mid-July as this will delay ripening

One of the criteria for Awards For All is Bringing Communities Together and the Meeting shed allows the many different nationalities and cultures represented on the site to meet together for social events or just to share a cup of tea. *South Yardley Allotments Association*

Repairs under the Flo Pickering Fund.

The BDAC will once again be meeting the engineers from the Landscape Practise Group, who are responsible for drawing up the jobs , seeking contactors and monitoring works. We will be pressing for the LPG to make more progress. Clive Birch is collating to bids for works to be done.
