For those of you that are not aware, when Allotment land is sold a portion of the money raised has to be spent on allotments. This a because of an agreement between the BDAC and Birmingham City Council. This money is held by BCC and is called The Florence Pickering Fund. The Council has held the fund for a long time and because of BDAC pressure is now actively spending it on Allotment Sites across the City. Making improvements to fence security, roads and installing toilets where none exist. We are now starting to take more requests for work using this fund, so if your site needs some repairs please contact us and we will help you apply.

LINKS WITH THE NATIONAL SOCIETY

The BDAC feels that it is important to create links with Associations and groups outside of Birmingham. We have in the past always worked closely close with the National Society and value their support. We send representatives to the Area 5 meetings of the National Society, including the National A.G.M. and invite their representatives to our events.

The National Society employs a legal expert who seeks to protect Allotments at the national level including working with government. Plot holders can become individual members or Association members. The cost of Association membership is considerably cheaper!

This involves Associations applying for membership on behalf of their member plot holders.

There are benefits of membership, notably free personal insurance and a discounted seed scheme. Membership is worth thinking about.

The BDAC are going to join the National in June 2020 at the Gardener's World Event at where we will be promoting Birmingham's Allotments.

They are always on the lookout for volunteers at the Show, in return for a session talking to the public about Allotments and answering queries, volunteers get free entry to the exhibition. Quite a good deal! Also worth thinking about!

QUIZ EVENT AND FUND RAISING
