

April Provides Opportunity to Spread Autism Awareness and Acceptance

April provided a wonderful opportunity to celebrate Autism Acceptance Month by spreading awareness and acceptance about autism to a variety of groups in the communities in which we operate our programs. The Development Team was excited to serve as presenters at the First Lutheran Church WELCA (Women of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America) meeting and a luncheon at the Stanly County Senior Center.

Both groups learned about programs that impact the more than 100 individuals that we support every day, as well as general information about autism. We also enjoyed reading *All My Stripes*, the tale of a zebra with autism

tale of a zebra with autism learning to embrace his differences, to eleven kindergarten and first-grade classrooms at Central Elementary School. In addition, GHA Autism Supports donated copies of All My Stripes to Central Elementary and five copies to the public library locations in Stanly County. The official Autism Acceptance Banner was displayed on First Street in Albemarle during the first two weeks of April as well. Many of our residential programs celebrated with opportunities to make hand-made decorations and artwork displayed in their homes. In addition, both Dee Pankey-Thompson and Lori Ivey were on hand representing GHA Autism Supports as the County of Stanly adopted an official proclamation declaring April as Autism


connections between people and opens pathways to expressing one's self." Michaela's visits have quickly become a favorite amongst the participants at Port City Academy!

to Duke Endowment

GHA Autism Supports continues to pilot new modalities as a part of our Duke Endowment Grant Whole Person Integrative Care project. We are excited to have Corey-Beth Travaglini, a level two certified Reiki instructor, introduce reiki with the individuals at Morrow Valley Farmstead. Reiki is an energy healing technique that promotes relaxation and reduces stress through gentle touch. Reiki practitioners use their hands to deliver energy to your body helping you become physically, emotionally, mentally, and spiritually balanced. Data on blood pressure, pulse, and mood, taken before and after the Reiki sessions, indicate that it is proving very relaxing for most of the participants. Staff reports indicate that this soothing effect appears to last several hours, making it a very promising therapeutic intervention for our individuals.



GHA Autism Supports has enjoyed a longstanding partnership with the Charlotte Chapter of Speedway Children Charities. This spring, residents from the Marie G. Smith Home participated in an art project with Stephen Wilson Art Studio in Mint Hill, NC. The background was created with vintage album covers that were individually painted, then cut into pieces, collaged and then embroidered together to make a unique tapestry. The beautiful finished work of art was featured at the recent Speedway's Gala fundraiser. Following the art project, youth were treated to snacks, a pizza lunch, and a beautiful piece of personal artwork that each person handcrafted to display in their rooms. GHA receives funding annually through Speedway Children's Charities to help purchase equipment and supplies for our children and adolescent homes. The Development Team volunteers annually during race events to help raise funds that are distributed to charities serving children in our area, including GHA Autism Supports.
