From the excitement of boat rides and tubing to the laughter shared on the docks, it was a beautiful reminder of how special this community truly is. Event organizers along with many other volunteers work to secure boaters, in-kind donations as well as monetary support to help make the day successful. We are so thankful for the Lake Tillery boating community that came together to provide such a wonderful experience for youth and adults! Your kindness, time, and energy created a day full of joy and memories that will last a lifetime. WTW is a 501(c) (3) non-profit organization that provides watersport opportunities to youth and adults with developmental disabilities, as well as abused and neglected children and wounded warriors. The first Wake the World event in the US started in 2008 with eight families providing a day on the lake for residents of a local children's home. Today WTW is the largest all-volunteer event of its kind with more than 500 volunteered boats worldwide. Lake Tillery WTW started in 2014. 

### Pfeiffer OT Students Partner with GHA to Enhance Autonomy

This summer, students from the Pfeiffer University Occupational Therapy program partnered with GHA Autism Supports at Carolina Farms to complete a meaningful research project titled "Enhancing Autonomy in Neurodevelopmental Disorders: The Role of KAWA in Shaping Client-Centered Care." The project explored the use of the KAWA model—an innovative, client-centered approach that uses the metaphor of a river to represent a person's life journey. By working alongside individuals in the homes at Carolina Farms, the students applied the KAWA framework to better understand each person's strengths, challenges, and goals. Through this collaboration, the students gained valuable hands-on experience in tailoring

occupational therapy interventions that promote independence and self-determination. This partnership highlights the importance of academic and community collaboration, reinforcing GHA's commitment to advancing opportunities that enrich the lives of individuals with autism and other neurodevelopmental disorders. Director of Recreation and Safety John Fields and Chief Development Officer Beth Olivieri were on hand to hear the results of the student research presentations on August 11th.
