GHA Quality Management's Approach: Always Room for Improvement!

Every fiscal year, Quality Management implements projects to improve the quality of services. The most exciting project focused on launching and tracking a Quality Site Visits Program for all GHA service sites. GHA Autism Supports offers 19 residences and two day services programs. In the past, there were site visits that monitored quality service delivery. However, most visits to service sites were follow-ups to potential breaches in quality. The ambitious goal was to design a program that systematically monitored the quality of all service sites. Planning began in July 2022, the start of the fiscal year. Visits would not be scheduled; Direct Service Professionals would be notified when the evaluator arrived outside the site. Visits would be viewed as team efforts to have the best possible service site. The next step was developing a comprehensive evaluation form to be completed for all visits. The form noted such items as: (1) individuals are dressed appropriately, (2) individuals' hair and nails are neat, (3) individuals are engaged in activities, (4) privacy issues were handled appropriately, (5) staff voice tone and interaction were positive. Then, the program was launched by the Quality Management Program. The actual visits began October 2022 and were evaluated nine months later. After each visit, a summary of the visit was sent to the Site Manager, the Coordinator of Site Managers, Chief of Quality Management and others, as needed. If there were changes needed to increase site quality, plans were developed. All the data supported the Program's success. Over the course of nine months, 56 visits were made!
