Promoting Understanding During Autism Acceptance Month

GHA Autism Supports was excited to recognize April as "Autism Acceptance Month" with a number of activities geared towards providing information and resources for communities to be more aware of autism, promote acceptance, and be more inclusive in everyday life. "With the prevalence of autism in the United States rising from being 1 in 125 children (2010) to 1 in 44 children (2022), the need for information is greater than ever," shared GHA Autism Supports CEO Dawn Allen. "Forward-looking organizations can do much better than having an outdated, performative Autism Awareness Day. Celebrating autism acceptance and inclusion rather than simply awareness can not only improve the well-being of the autism community, but it can also amplify the strength and vibrancy of the autism culture all together."

GHA organizers worked with City of Albemarle officials to create an official Autism Acceptance Month Proclamation that was approved at the March 21st meeting of the Albemarle City Council. In addition, children's books highlighting the life of autism self-advocate Temple Grandin were donated to all of the Stanly County public library locations. The GHA Autism Supports Marketing Department designed and sold autism acceptance t-shirts and pushed out a plethora of information on all of the organization's social media outlets throughout the month. PROCLAMATION OF THE CITY OF ALBEMARLE

Adopted on the 21st day of March 2022

WHEREAS, we pledge to promote residential, health, employment and social opportunities for individuals of all abilities.

WHEREAS, we recognize the importance of empowering individuals with autism to live lives of dignity, self-determination and respect.

WHEREAS, we value and celebrate the gifts and contributions of our neurodiverse community members.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that the City of Albemarle joins the United Nations and the US Government in proclaiming the month of April to be designated as

AUTISM ACCEPTANCE MONTH

as a symbol of our commitment to create a culture of diversity, inclusion and equity for all members.

GHA Autism Supports Receives High Marks from Accrediting Body



Over a three-day period in April, GHA Autism Supports was surveyed by CARF, an international accrediting agency in existence since 1966. CARF accredits more than 60,000 health and human services programs serving more than 15 million persons annually. Accreditation is a stringent peer review process that demonstrates conformance to a rigorous set of best practices and standards.

Many months of preparation went into the survey. GHA's policies, employee records, individuals' records, finances, performance improvement, individual rights, and many other governance areas were closely scrutinized. As part of the process, a number of individuals, families, staff, community members, members of the Board of Directors and administrative staff were interviewed. Surveyors toured the Central Office, and several of our sites and observed individuals at work and at home. Surveyors make many of the selections randomly, so we really appreciate everyone who made themselves available on short notice for interviews and tours.

Our survey was exceptional! The CARF team said GHA "had a lot to be proud of," our staff were "fantastic," recognized our parents as "very supportive," and concluded that our programs and services are of the highest quality. Thanks to everyone for all the hard work in preparation for this accreditation, but more importantly, all the hard work that goes on day in and day out to make GHA Autism Supports an outstanding agency!

NC State Students Collaborate with GHA

Grants Received to Further Morrow Valley Farmstead Animal Therapy

As programming expands at GHA's newest endeavor Morrow Valley Farmstead, grants totaling \$8,000 were received to support animal therapy efforts with the residents. Autism Speaks awarded a grant of \$5,000, while First Lutheran Church of Albemarle supported the program with a \$3,000 grant!
