### GOD'S GLORIOUS GLORY IS PAVED BY GOD'S GRACIOUS GRACE

Everything mysterious about your recreation is now revealed. God kept His plan and purpose concealed until Jesus finished His work on earth. Jesus purchased your salvation. Celebrate Jesus! "What we do see is Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the angels [Elohim]. Because of God's gift of undeserved grace, Jesus died for everyone. And now that Jesus has suffered and died, He is crowned with glory and honor!" Romans 5:2, (Voice). Jesus is the Way, the Truth, and the Life. Shadow Jesus! "Jesus leads us into a place of *radical* grace where we are able to celebrate the hope of experiencing God's glory," Hebrews 2:9, (CEV). As your life shines the light of Jesus, others will see Jesus as He really is. Shine Jesus! "All this is for your sakes, so that as grace flows out to more and more people, it may cause thanksgiving to overflow and bring glory to God," 2 Corinthians 4:15, (CJB).

### GRACE AFTER GRACE REPOSITIONS YOU FROM GLORY TO GLORY

Jesus bestows grace after grace upon you until you are crammed by the grace of God: "The Word became a human being. He made His home with us. We have seen His glory. It is the glory of the One and Only, Who came from the Father. And the Word was full of grace and truth," John 1:14, (NIRV). "(John testified concerning Him and exclaimed, 'This was the One of whom I said, 'The One coming after me has surpassed me, because He existed before me.'") Indeed, we have all received grace after grace from His fullness, for the law was given through Moses, grace and truth came through Jesus Christ," John 1:15-17, (HCSB). Then Jesus transforms you from one level of glory to the next level of glory until He can be visibly seen in you. When you look in the mirror you will see His face, not yours: "Nevertheless when it shall turn to the Lord, the vail shall be taken away. Now the Lord is that Spirit: and where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is liberty. But we all, with open face beholding as in a glass the glory of the Lord, are changed into the same image from glory to glory, even as by the Spirit of the Lord," 2 Corinthians 3:16-18, (KJV).

### JOINT COMMISSION OF THE RICHES OF GOD'S GRACE AND GLORY

The riches of God's grace join you to His divine purpose on earth: "In union with Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our offenses, according to the riches of God's grace that He lavished on us, along with all wisdom and understanding, when He made known to us the secret of His will. This was according to His plan that He set forth in the Messiah to usher in the fullness of the times and to bring together in the Messiah all things in heaven and on earth," Eph. 1:7-10, (ISV). The riches of God's glory join you to His divine plan on earth: "I pray that He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with power by His Spirit in the inner man, and that Christ may dwell in your hearts by faith, so that you, being rooted and grounded in love, may be able to comprehend with all the saints what is that breadth and length, depth and height, and to know what is the love of Christ, which love passes knowledge; that you might be filled with every kind of fullness that comes of God," Eph. 3:16-19, (NMB).

### THE RHYTHM OF THE SPIRIT OF GLORY AND THE SPIRIT OF GRACE

"Wisdom is the principal thing; therefore get wisdom: and with all thy getting get understanding. Exalt her, and she shall promote thee: she shall bring thee to honour, when thou dost embrace her. She shall give to thine head an ornament of grace: a crown of glory shall she deliver to thee. Hear, O my son, and receive my sayings; and the years of thy life shall be many," Prov. 4:7-10, (KJV). Embrace the wisdom to always permit God's glory: "Beloved, think it not strange concerning the fiery trial which is to try you, as though some strange thing happened unto you: But rejoice, inasmuch as ye are partakers of Christ's sufferings; that, when His glory shall be revealed, ye may be glad also with exceeding joy. If ye be reproached for the name of Christ, happy are ye; for the Spirit of glory and of God resteth upon you: on their part He is evil spoken of, but on your part He is glorified," 1 Pet. 4:12-14, (KJV). Embrace the wisdom to never prevent God's grace: "He that despised Moses' law died without mercy under two or three witnesses: Of how much sorer punishment, suppose ye, shall he be thought worthy, who hath trodden underfoot the Son of God, and hath counted the blood of the covenant, wherewith he was sanctified, an unholy thing, and hath done despite unto the Spirit of grace? For we know Him that hath said, Vengeance belongeth unto Me, I will recompense, saith the Lord. And again, The Lord shall judge His people," Heb. 10:28-30, (KJV). The wisdom Holy Spirit expresses keeps you in rhythm with the heartbeat of God's glory and grace.

### Thought for Transformation

*"He who did not withhold His own Son, but gave Him up for all of us, will He not with Him also give us everything else?" Romans 8:32, (NRSV). "For Jehovah Elohim is a sun and shield: Jehovah will give grace and glory; no good thing will He withhold from them that walk uprightly," Ps. 84:11, (Darby). Withhold is not in God's vocabulary.*

### The Grace-Glory Pledge

*Trials don't strengthen you; they reveal strength already possessed. 1) The grace of God serves as the first responder which permanently leads you to the glory of God. "After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace [who imparts His blessing and favor], who called you to His own eternal glory in Christ, will Himself complete, confirm, strengthen, and establish you [making you what you ought to be]," 1 Pet. 5:10 (AMP). 2) The grace of God raises the barrier erected in your way as you give glory to God in the midst of the trial of your faith. "For this thing I besought the Lord thrice, that it might depart from me. And He said unto me, My grace is sufficient for thee: for My strength is made perfect in weakness. Most gladly therefore will I rather glory in my infirmities, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. Therefore I take pleasure in infirmities, in reproaches, in necessities, in persecutions, in distresses for Christ's sake: for when I am weak, then am I strong," 2 Cor. 12:8-10, (KJV). Grace lifts heavy weights so the weight of glory can land.*
