WALK EVENTS This year our board members participated in 6 walks to help raise awareness and critical resources for mental health. These walks are often organized during the month of May when our nation highlights and celebrates Mental Health Awareness Month. One of these walks, held in November, gave us the unique opportunity to partner with a local Sigma Pi Fraternity Chapter. Nearly 100 impressive young men made t-shirts and showed up to represent the importance of men's mental health and break the stigma around mental illness.

GIVING TUESDAY

Recognized worldwide, Giving Tuesday is a dedicated day to encourage charitable giving following the Thanksgiving holiday. For AMCF, it is one of the most important days of the year because it reminds our community that even small acts of kindness create big change for caregivers. Thanks to the generosity of our donors—and the power of corporate matching gifts—we are proud to share that we once again raised more than \$10,000 to help underwrite our caregiver grants. These contributions directly strengthen our programs, ensuring caregivers receive the support, resources, and recognition they deserve.

HIGHLIGHTS



50/50 RAFFLE

As we looked for creative ways to continue funding our important College Scholarship Program, AMCF introduced its first-ever 50/50 fundraising raffle. The effort generated over \$5,000 in proceeds, enabling us to award 9 scholarships to young caregivers pursuing higher education this next year. This initiative reflects our commitment to supporting students who balance academic progress with the significant responsibilities of caregiving. Nationally, the need is great—an estimated 1.6 million youth (ages 15–18) in the U.S. serve as family caregivers, often at the expense of their own educational opportunities. This initiative, along with a generous contribution from Dawn Vendt and Ed O'Callaghan, reinforced our ability to sustain and grow the program.

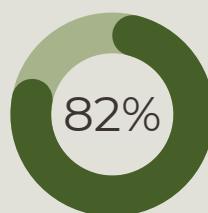

PROGRESS OF OUR PROGRAMS

For every \$1.00 we spent during this fiscal year, \$0.90 went directly to someone in need, compared to last year's \$0.82. Put another way, every \$10 gift directly placed \$9 into the hands of caregivers through grants, scholarships, resources, and support services. This increase reflects our growth as an organization, careful management of administrative costs, and dedication to ensuring resources go where they are needed most—DIRECTLY TO CAREGIVERS.

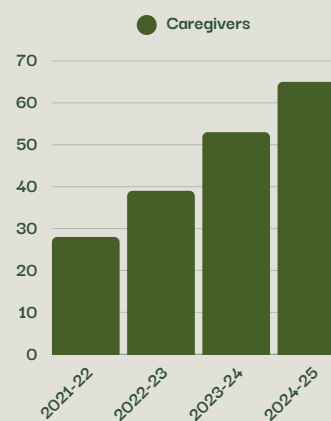
