From the Pastor:

On a recent Sunday, as a part of Calvary's anniversary celebration, we held a "Throwback Sunday," in which we invited people to come to church dressed in a style reminiscent of an era in the last 100 years. I was impressed with the people who "dressed up." One person wore her mother's wedding dress from 98 years ago. We had a hippie sitting in one of the front pews. There was a guy wearing pants from the 70's (hoping they would split when he sat down). There were dresses and suits from a number of "ages past." It was a truly impressive array of attire.

As I surveyed the congregation that morning though, I thought of a more interesting challenge. I wondered what this group might have looked like if we had asked them to dress up in a style that would be popular sometime in the *next* 100 years. That is, in a sense, what one our members challenged us to think about as a part of this anniversary celebration. It is fun to look back and remember who we were, but it is maybe more important for us to look forward and consider who God's wants us to be in the future.

We know who we were in the past. On November 3 we will celebrate that great cloud of witnesses that have gone before us. We will acknowledge those whose courage and faith started a Sunday School here 100 years ago. We will rejoice for the saints who built the basement church and those who raised up a sanctuary on top of that basement. We will remember those who passed their faith on to us and shared the faith with the community and with the world. We thank God for all those people of our past.

But, on the eve of our anniversary celebration it is good for us to also consider what God wants us to look like for the next 100 years. Who will be filling our pew? What will we be doing to spread the Word in Moline and throughout the world? Who will be the people that God is calling us to serve and how will we be doing it?

As our celebration of the past 100 years reaches its zenith on November 3 it is important that we not let that be an ending, but rather a beginning. May our anniversary celebration be the launching pad (I thought a space reference was appropriate here) into our future as the people of God as Calvary Lutheran Church.

## RELAY FOR LIFE – 2019 WRAP-UP REPORT


The Calvary Crusaders Relay Team had a very successful year supporting the 2019 ACS Relay for Life held on Saturday, Sept. 21. Because of rain/wind/cold (miserable) weather, the event was held at the Bettendorf Middle School gym.

Sale of quilt raffle tickets netted a profit of \$199 toward relay. The quilt was won by Linda Preilly of Bettendorf.

We served Culver's Custard purchased from their E. Moline store and baked goods furnished by the relay team.

All proceeds from sales totaled \$416.05. After totaling all our fund raising and donations for the year, our Calvary Crusaders contributions totalled \$3,634.05 to the Quad Cities Relay for Life.

- Volunteer office help
- Help with property maintenance and/or repair
- Serve on the church council

- Welcome visitors
- Be a Back door Greeter

- Help with publicity and/or photography


