From the Pastor,

Earlier in my career, when I was younger and had more energy, I was among the many pastors who railed against Christmas celebrations/activities during Advent. I bemoaned Santa Claus and Christmas decorations making an appearance in the stores almost before the Halloween decorations were down. I constantly changed stations on the car radio when Christmas music played during the early days of December. Advent, I staunchly asserted, is not Christmas, and Advent needs to be observed. You can't just skip Advent.

Now that I'm older, hopefully wiser, and certainly more tired, I have almost given up the fight. I still resist the temptation to put up Christmas lights before Thanksgiving (although I am regretting not doing it when it was  $75^{0}$  outside last week). And it will still be a week or so before I drag the Christmas tree out of the attic.

However, I have to admit that I've been watching Hallmark Christmas movies since October, I've submitted my Christmas list to Santa (i.e. Amazon), and find myself humming Christmas carols. So, even though the first Sunday in Advent is still a few days away, I will throw up my arms and somewhat reluctantly say, "Let Christmas begin."

Yet (and this is where the "wiser" may come into play) I don't think this is a complete surrender to the commercialistic culture. Perhaps Christianity and ecclesiology (things related to the church, like the seasons of the church year) play a role in the blurring of the line between Advent (the time of waiting for the arrival of the messiah) and Christmas (the celebration of the birth of our savior and the recognition that God is with us).

You see, the Christian church always lives in a **paradox** (a seemingly absurd or self-contradictory statement or proposition that when investigated or explained may prove to be well founded or true). As Christians we believe we live in a time when the reign of Christ has begun while at the same time we await the Kingdom of God. In short, we live in a time of "already but not yet."

If you are struggling to make sense of that statement, that's ok. I don't think it is meant to make sense. It is a part of the mystery of God.

In the season of Advent we await the birth of the Christ child even though Jesus was obviously born a long time ago. We also await the coming kingdom of God even though that kingdom began in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus. In Christian theology we talk about God's kingdom being here already and not yet. It is a paradox.

Hence, if the church can blur the line between "already and not yet," then maybe it's ok for us to blur the line between Advent and Christmas. We know that God is with us already through the child of Bethlehem and that is worth celebrating every day. But it is also important for us to pause in the midst of that Christmas joy and remember that God is not yet finished with us.

So, let's not forget to observe Advent, too. Let's remember that God, who is here now, is also still to come to make all things complete.

#### FROM THE PARISH NURSE

Matter of balance tip: to prevent falling when its icy remember to walk like a penguin: feet slightly turned out, knees a little bent and



arms straight pointing out from the body (make a triangle with your head the point of the triangle and your arms the other 2 ponts). Then walk like a penguin, small shuffle steps. Check the soles of your boots and shoes to be sure the tread isn't worn smooth.

Remember to go to the emergency room if you have chest pain, change in level of consciousness, excessive bleeding from a wound, mouth or rectum or excruciating constant pain. It's best to see your health care provider or go to one of the walk in clinics for other problems. You will wait hours in the emergency room if it's not a life-threatening problem. If you have an orthopedic emergency ORA has walk in hours 8-5pm Mon-Fri, no referral or appointment needed, you only need to call 911 or drive to the hospital if you have an open fracture.
