From the Pastor

I think from a very early age we are taught that we need to pay our dues for the things we expect to receive. I remember as a Cub Scout, at the age of six or seven, dutifully bringing money to the weekly den meetings. I knew it was these dues that paid for craft materials and the various badges that I might receive. When I was in high school I joined the Key Club and paid my dues to support the club activities. In college I participated in the bowling club and paid my weekly dues that helped to cover the cost of the end-of-theseason trophies. (I still have my trophy as a proud member of the last place team in the league.) As an adult I belonged briefly to the local Kiwanis Club and paid my weekly dues to cover lunch and the projects of the club. Yes, the lesson is regularly reiterated that if one wants to participate, one must pay their dues.

Sadly, I think people often see their offerings to the church in the same way. And I suppose, in subtle ways, the church may encourage that viewpoint. I remember as a child in Sunday School being expected to deliver my little offering envelope every week. It felt a lot like my Cub Scout dues. Congregations often hand out pledge or commitment or intent cards at the same time we start talking about next year's budget. It isn't a big leap to think that what the church is asking for is money to cover the expense of membership. In fact, I have heard active church members refer to their weekly offerings as "dues." And more often that I care to admit I have had people tell me that they want to keep up some kind of regular offering to the church "so that I can have my funeral there." Somewhere along the line we have communicated to people that if they want to receive the benefits of the church, they must pay their dues.

However, I think that is exactly opposite of what our offerings should be about. They are not, to use a phrase very much in the news lately, a *quid pro quo*. Instead, our offerings should reflect God's relationship with us – a relationship of love. First and

foremost, God loves us. God loves us not because we have done something special...not because we are especially good and wholesome...and certainly not because we have anything to offer God. God loves us because God has chosen to love us. And what God asks of us in return is our love for him.

Our offerings, then, are a response to God's gracious love for us. Our offerings are a response to all that God has provided for us. As Martin Luther writes in his explanation to the first article of the Apostles' Creed in the Small Catechism,

....God daily and abundantly provides shoes and clothing, food and drink, house and farm, spouse and children, fields, livestock and all property – along with all the necessities and nourishment for this body and life....For all of this I owe it to God to thank and praise, serve and obey him. This is most certainly true.

Luther's point (and my point) is that our offerings are given in response to what God has done for us. God's love for us does not depend on what we offer to God. You are a member of God's family because God has chosen you, not because you pay your dues. Your offerings are tokens of your love for God.

I encourage you, then, to let your offerings not be some sort of dues to cover the cost of church membership, but rather let it be a gift to God in thanks for all that God has done for you.







CHURCH COUNCIL MEMBERS




