From the Pastor,

So those who welcomed his message were baptized, and that day about three thousand persons were added. They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers. (Acts 2:41-41)

The passage above is the conclusion of the Pentecost story from the 2^{nd} chapter of Acts. After the turbulence of the Spirit blowing through the upper room, tongues as of fire alighting on the disciples and the preaching of the good news to the gathered masses all in their native languages, about 3000 new members were added to the rolls of this first Christian church. Then, as the chapter draws to a close, the author of *The Acts of the Apostles*, describes what this very first Christian fellowship looked like. "They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers."

Here is what early church looked like:

- It was a gathering of the faithful who took the time to listen to the *apostles' teaching*. And what were the apostles teaching? They were sharing the events of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. They were teaching what Jesus had taught them. They were relating the stories of Jesus' appearances to them following the resurrection.
- And they were sharing in fellowship *koinonia* is the Greek word. *Koinonia* is more than just a socializing. *Koinonia* implies a spirit-filled commitment to one another, supporting each other, caring for each other, and bearing one another's burdens.
- They devoted themselves to the breaking of bread. I think this is understood on two levels. They shared together in table fellowship. There is an intimacy involved in eating together. (If you want to verify, try going into McDonald's and sitting down at a table with strangers to eat your meal. I would be willing to bet that everyone at that table would be extremely uncomfortable.) We don't eat with just anyone. And, of course, on a different level I'm certain that the author of Acts is also talking about sharing communion, partaking of the Lord's body and blood in the sacrament.
- Finally, the disciples devoted themselves to the prayers. Here the author is referring not just to the act of praying, but of worshiping. "The prayers" were the appointed times for praying at the temple. It was a liturgical act.

And so the very first gathering of Christians after the resurrection devoted themselves to (in very Lutheran terms) word and sacrament. They committed themselves to gathering to hear the word of God, to worship, to participate in the sacraments, and to take care of each other. That is what the church looked like 2000 years ago.

And that is still the model of the church today. Christians continue to gather around word and sacrament. We gather each week to worship God, to hear the word, share in the Lord's supper, to pray, and to care for each other...

Throughout this season of Lent, I pray that you take the time to "be the church" with us at Calvary. Join us as we devote ourselves to the apostles' teaching and fellowship, to the breaking of bread and the prayers.


