

From the Pastor,

One of the symbols of Easter is the butterfly. The idea, of course, is that the butterfly transforms from a caterpillar to a beautiful butterfly, free to take wing and fly. And the last stage of this metamorphosis is the pupa stage in which the caterpillar is encased in its chrysalis, a skin-like covering that completely envelopes the caterpillar. The image for Easter, then, is the butterfly breaking free of the bonds of the tomblike chrysalis to emerge to a new life as a butterfly, just as Jesus emerged from the tomb into a new life as the Christ.

Perhaps this year we can relate to this transformation more than ever before. For the past year we have entombed in social distancing, stay-at-home orders, mask mandates, closed restaurants and suspended inperson worship services. The isolation for many has been difficult. For some it may have felt a little like dying.

Yet now, as Easter approaches, it appears that we have finally gotten ahead of the virus. Our time in this chrysalis encased pandemic may, at long last, be nearing an end. We can get a sense that the tomb is opening, and a new, post-pandemic, life is beginning. There is, honestly, a sense of being able to stretch our wings and fly away in the freedom of a new life.

And that really is what Easter is about. The tomb of death could not hold Jesus. His resurrection to a new life in God is *our* resurrection to a new life in God. Because he lives, we will live also (John 14:19). The old caterpillar in us, the old sinful self, is transformed into a new being ready to fly in the love and forgiveness of God. It is a time to celebrate.

But, let me also offer a word of caution. So often the image of the butterfly emerging from the chrysalis is one of instant flight. The truth, however, is that the time immediately after breaking from the chrysalis is the most dangerous time in the life of the butterfly. At that point its wings are wet and it can't fly. It is most vulnerable to predators for about its first hour of new life.

I offer that cautionary tale as a reminder to you that while we will be able to worship together on Easter and celebrate our new life in Christ, the new found freedom from the virus is still tenuous. We are still vulnerable. And so to be safe, our Easter celebration will not be like it has been in the past. We still need to be careful, for the sake of others, to guard against spreading the virus. We will still need to maintain safe distances, wear masks, and refrain from singing out loud.

At the same time, though, we will have a foretaste of the new life ahead for us in and through the resurrection of Jesus.

do. Indoor jobs will be cleaning some windows, organizing in the kitchen and some closet areas, and dusting. If you can bring your own tools. All are welcome and needed!




Serving at Cafe on Vine May 1
