## From the Pastor,

I realize that sometimes in the church we use language that may not be obvious to some who were not raised in the church. So, I decided to use this space this month to explain the “Church Year” in a little more detail.

### Lent/Easter

While the church year technically begins with Advent, it is probably a little more appropriate to begin a discussion of the church year with Easter, the celebration of the resurrection of Jesus and the most significant event in the Christian church.

Since Christ’s resurrection occurred around the time of the Jewish festival of the Passover, Easter comes at the same time of year as the Passover. Passover is celebrated on the 14<sup>th</sup> day of the month of Nisan (the first day of the full moon in the first month of spring). In order to separate the celebration of Easter from the celebration of Passover, the Christian church, in the year 325, set the date for Easter Sunday to the first Sunday after first full moon of spring. As a result, the date for Easter can be anywhere between March 22 and April 25.

Moving backward from Easter is the season of preparation for Easter which is called Lent. Lent, which means “spring,” is a somber season of repentance. In keeping with the Biblical significance of “40” (years of the exodus from Egypt to Israel or Jesus’ 40 days in the wilderness, for example), Lent is 40 days long, not counting Sundays (because Sundays are always a celebration of the resurrection and not penitential). The Sundays that fall within this season are referred to as the Sundays *in* Lent. The color of Lent is purple to suggest somberness and solemnity.

Since Easter is a greater celebration than the penitential season of Lent, Easter is a longer celebration. So, Easter is not one day, or even one week, but seven weeks long. Therefore, we have seven Sundays *of* Easter. The color of the Easter season is white, suggesting gladness, light and joy.

The season of Easter culminates on Pentecost, the 50<sup>th</sup> day. Notice the connection between the prefix “pente” (as in Pentagon – a five-sided building in Washington – for instance) and the festival on the 50<sup>th</sup> day. Pentecost celebrates the gift of the Holy Spirit to the church from the

risen Christ. The color for the day of Pentecost is red, symbolizing the fire of the Holy Spirit.

### Advent/Christmas

The other significant event in the life of Christ is his birth, which the church celebrates at Christmas. Though there is no clear reason why Christ’s birth is celebrated on December 25, much of the Christian church has been using that date since at least the early 4<sup>th</sup> century. (Parts of the church celebrate the birth of Christ on January 6). There are twelve days of Christmas and with one or two Sundays *of* Christmas. The color of the Christmas season, like Easter, is white.

The Christmas season concludes with festival of Epiphany, which means “revelation of God,” on January 6.

As with Easter, traditions within the early church developed around a season of preparation for Christmas called Advent. There are four Sundays *of* Advent. Advent’s color is blue, suggesting hope as we await the arrival of the savior.

### The Other Times

There are two blocks of time not associated with the major festivals of Easter and Christmas. One falls between the Epiphany (January 6) and the beginning of Lent, the other between Pentecost and Advent. The color of both seasons is green, signifying the growth of the church.

The Sundays of the first block of time are referred to as the Sundays *after* the Epiphany. These Sundays typically tell the stories of the call of the first disciples and Jesus being revealed as the messiah.

The second time period includes the Sundays *after* Pentecost. This long season stretches through the summer and fall and the readings tell the story of Jesus and the early church.

Some parts of the Christian church refer to the Sundays after the Epiphany and the Sundays after Pentecost as “Ordinary Time.”

I hope this brief introduction to the church year has been helpful.
