### **From the Pastor,**

The 4<sup>th</sup> chapter of Genesis relates the story of Cain and Abel. In the story, you may remember, Cain is jealous of Abel and kills him. God immediately notices that something is amiss, approaches Cain, and asks where Abel is. Cain replies, “I do not know; am I my brother’s keeper?” (Genesis 4:9)

God doesn’t give a direct response to Cain because that isn’t the point. God already knows where Abel is.

However, based on what I read in the prophets and in the gospels and in the epistles, I think the answer to Cain’s question is obvious. Unequivocally I believe that the Lord’s answer to Cain would be a resounding “YES!” Yes, Cain, you are your brother’s keeper. You are responsible for your brother. And the word of God through the prophets, the teachings of Jesus and the insights of Paul all affirm that emphatic “YES!”

And that “YES!” does not only apply to Cain, but to all of us as well. The word of the Lord to God’s people through the prophets accuses them of failing to care for the poor, the orphans, and the widows. Jesus identifies his own ministry as one who has been sent to proclaim release to the captives, recovery of sight to the blind, to let the oppressed go free, (Luke 4) and tells those who are following him that they are responsible for feeding the hungry, giving water to the thirsty, caring for the sick, visiting the imprisoned (Matthew 25). Paul, throughout his letters, encourages the members of the church to recognize that they are all interconnected as the body of Christ and that what effects one member effects them all. Indeed, as Christians, we are responsible not just for ourselves, but for everyone else around us.

I think our contemporary culture is emphasizing the exact opposite of what God teaches us through the prophets and Paul and Jesus. In considering the question, “Am I my brother’s keeper?” I’m afraid many of the people in our world today would say, “No.” The prevailing attitude, I think, is one of pure self-interest.

I suspect that we are coming into a period of time when we may be challenged to live out the word of God that calls on us to be our brother’s keeper. Many health experts are predicting that our battle with Covid-19 is not over. Variants of the virus will continue to spread and threaten the gains that have been made. If they are right, then attitudes and actions of self-interest could make the situation worse for many people.

And so, as Christians, we need to be aware that the correct answer to the question, “Am I my brother’s or sister’s keeper?” is “YES!” In the way of Christ, we are absolutely responsible for those around us. As children of God and members of the body of Christ we are called on to care for each other, even if means giving up some of our personal freedom and/or comforts.

As we hopefully bring this struggle against Covid-19 to a close, our Christian responsibility is to do everything we can, and not just those things that don’t inconvenience us, to protect those around us. That’s what it means to love as God first loved us.


### **BIBLE STUDY**


### For Aid to Kids in Romania
