#### From the Pastor,

So, you're not sure about the Book of Revelation. Your impression is that it is a frightening book along the lines of a Stephen King novel. And maybe the parts you have heard or read about just seem to be a series of cryptic images that would take a genius to figure out, much like the movie/novel *The DaVinci Code*. So why bother studying it?

But, maybe it's not as frightening as you may think. Nor is it as unfamiliar.

Do these hymn verses sound familiar?

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty! Early in the morning our song shall rise to thee. Holy, holy, holy, merciful and mighty! God in three persons, blessed Trinity!

Holy, holy! All the saints adore thee,

Casting down their golden crowns around the glassy sea;

Cherubim and seraphim falling down before thee, which wert and art, and evermore shalt be. (ELW 413)

This hymn, written by Reginald Heber, is a paraphrase of Revelation 4:8-10. In the book, as in our hymnal, it is a song of praise to God.

Or perhaps you've heard this hymn:

- Mine eyes have seen the glory of the coming of the Lord;
- He is trampling out the vintage where the grapes of wrath are stored;
- He has loosed the fateful lightning of his terrible swift sword:

His truth is marching on.

### Refrain

Glory, glory! Hallelujah! Glory, glory! Hallelujah!

Glory, glory! Hallelujah! His truth is marching on. (ELW 890)

This hymn, by Julia Ward Howe, was inspired by Revelation 14:19-20 and reflects the passage's vision of judgement and the call to remain committed to God as we await God's justice.

In fact, the Book of Revelation is addressed to the Christian church at the time of John of Patmos (around 100 AD) as he encouraged the people of God to remain faithful to God during times of stress (and sometimes times of affluence). He used vivid images to help communicate his message, word pictures so striking they are hard to forget. Most of all, though, the Book of Revelation is a book of hope – hope in the love, justice and mercy of God.

# **CALVARY CRUSADERS:**


