Red Sox take another series



Comeback victory in game 1 of the series and timely hitting allowed the Red Sox to take the series

The Red Sox won two of three on the road at Washington. The Sox are 7-2 on the road this season. In game 1 the Sox got out to an early 1-0 lead on a right field blast by Josh Naylor. Michael King pitched poorly and only lasted 4 1/3 giving up 6 earned runs and a homerun.

He also struck out 7. The Red Sox bullpen held Washington scoreless the rest of the game and allowed the team to come back to tie it in the eighth. Josh Bell continued his hot hitting going 3 for 6 and hit a three-run homerun in the sixth to bring the Sox closer. In the seventh the rally began after Logan Gilbert got two quick strikeouts. Dubon singled to left chasing Logan Gilbert from the game. Jacob Webb came on and gave up a run on an error committed by Jazz Chisholm Jr. Bell then singled to right to tie the game. a single by Dubon and a walk to Bell. Diaz made it interesting in the 9th, but he was able to get Chisolm Jr to ground out with the tying runs on base. Game 2 was well pitched by Sonny Gray winning 3-1 and Game 3 the Red Sox took it 7-4 as Elly De LaCruz hit his 2nd homer of the season to back Brady Singer. Next week the Red Sox travel to Seattle to conclude their road trip.

Dubon hit streak at 13 games



Washington, D.C. – Dubon pushed his hit streak to 13 at Washington. He went 3 for 6 in game one and 1 for 5 in game 3 after getting a much-needed day off in game 2. Dubon reunited in Boston in the offseason has been contributing to the early season surge in Boston. Dubon drafted by the Red Sox in the 26th round in 2013, he was traded to Milwaukee in 2016. He tore his ACL while with the Brewers and was traded to San Francisco in 2019 and made his major league debut in San Francisco. He was traded to Houston in May of 2022 and was signed as a free agent this year. Dubon is hitting .419 through 14 games.
