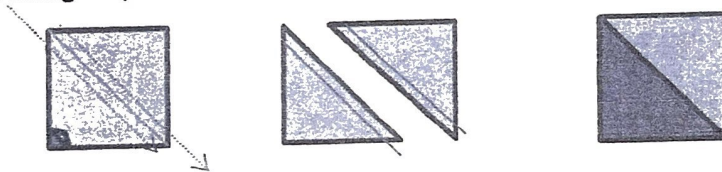
Fabric Requirements:

Choose a **color** and collect 5 ½ to 6 yards of **assorted values** of scraps and/or yardages. These are used for the blocks, and binding.

Backing 4 yards
Batting twin size

Step 1

Using several of your larger pieces of scraps, cut 120 4 7/8 inch squares. Draw a diagonal line on the back side of half of the squares. Pair each marked square with an unmarked one, right sides together and sew a scant ¼ inch on each side of the diagonal line. Cut on the diagonal line. Press to make a half square triangle squares that measures 4 ½ inches. You should have 120 half square triangle units.



Note: You may use your favorite method to make these units as long as they measure 4 ½ inches and will finish to 4 inches in your quilt.

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Step 2

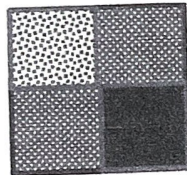
Cut 7 2 ½ inch strips width of fabric of assorted fabrics and set aside for binding. (or about 290 inches)

Cut 2 ½ inch strips from scraps. Sew them together in pairs on the long edge. Press to the darker fabric. Cut the strip sets into 60 (2 ½ inch) segments. Be sure to square up the strip often.



Sew the 2 ½ inch segments into 4 patches. These should measure 4 ½ inches **unfinished**.

Make 30.



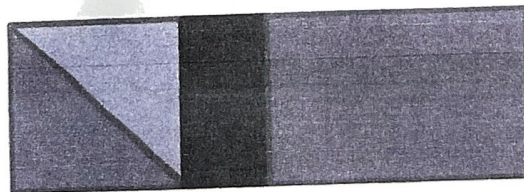
Note: You may sew your 4 patch units from 2 ½ inch squares if your scraps are too small for strips.

Cut 4 ½ inch strips from scraps. Cross cut into 30 2 ½ X 4 ½ inch pieces. And 30 6 ½ X 4 ½ ins pieces.

Use 30 of the half square triangles from step one and the pieces just cut to make section A.



Make 30 section A.

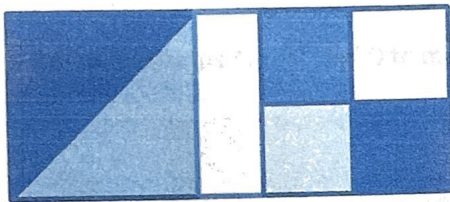

Step Three

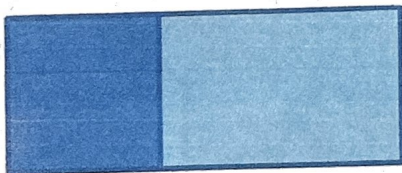
1. Cut thirty $1\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces from assorted fabrics. Assemble thirty sections as shown below using these pieces, thirty of the half square triangles from Step One, and the 4-patch units from Step Two.



2. Cut thirty $1\frac{1}{2} \times 4\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces from assorted fabrics. Assemble thirty sections as shown below using these pieces and two of the half square triangles from Step One.



3. Cut thirty $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares and thirty $3\frac{1}{2} \times 5\frac{1}{2}$ inch rectangles from assorted fabrics and sew them together as shown.



Next month, we assemble the blocks and put them together!

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Step 4

Cut $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips from scraps. Cross cut into 30 $3\frac{1}{2}$ X $5\frac{1}{2}$ inch strips and 30 $3\frac{1}{2}$ inch squares.



Make 30 section D.

Assemble sections A, B, C, and D to make 30 Blocks.



Sew sections B and C together first. Then add section D to the right side. Finally, sew section A to the top of the block. Make 30.



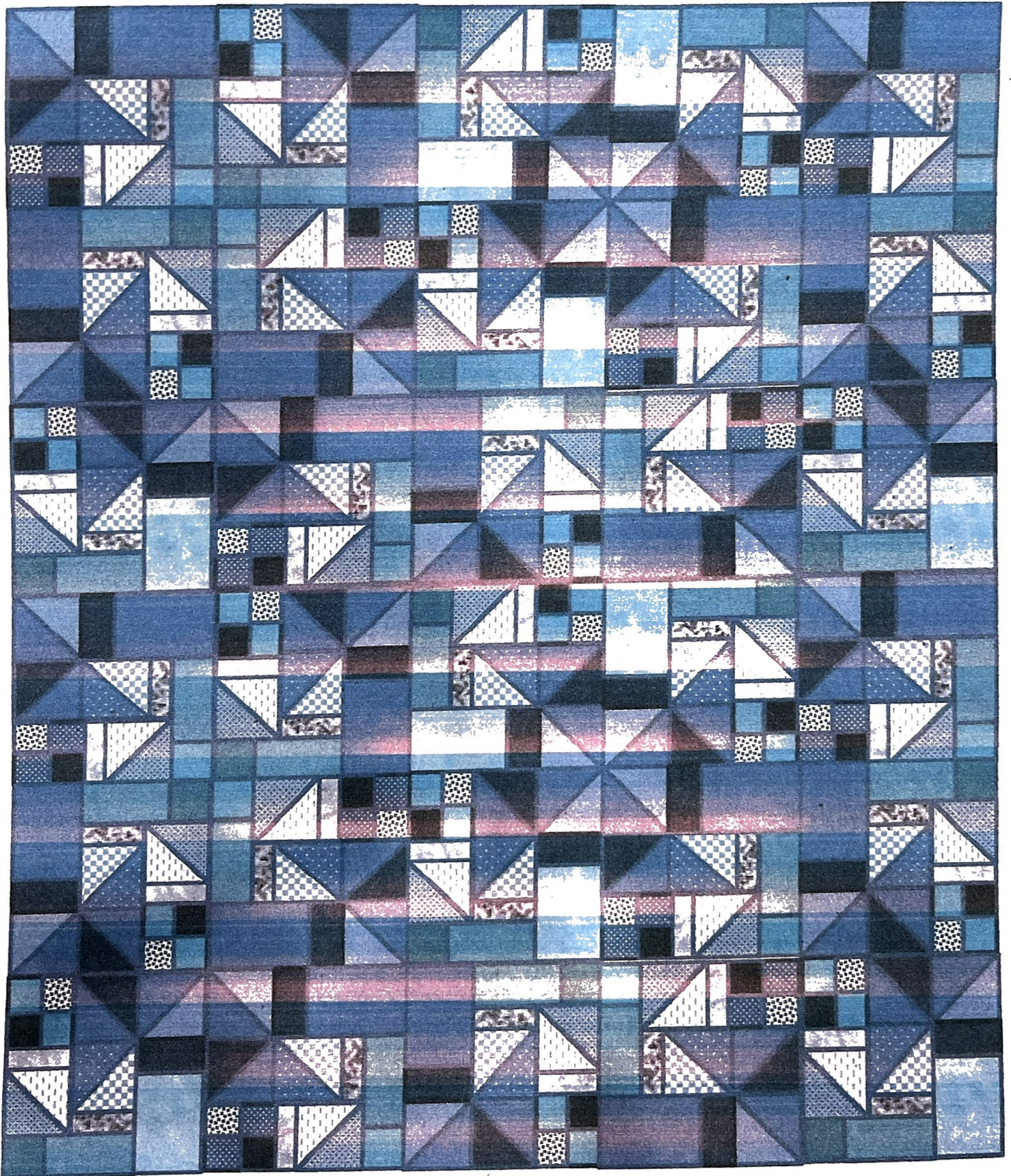
This is your finished block. Only step left is to assemble them!

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Step 5. Lets finish this! Layout your blocks rotating each a quarter turn or until it is pleasing to you. Sew them together. Quilt, bind, and LABEL. Enjoy!



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
