Rebekah Stewart Wins HD-30 Democratic Assembly

25-point victory for Colorado State House candidate

LAKEWOOD, COLO. – Colorado State House District 30 candidate Rebekah Stewart (D-Lakewood) decisively won the HD-30 Democratic nominating assembly held today—securing “top line” on June’s Democratic primary ballot by a 25-point margin.

“I am honored to have received such an overwhelming endorsement from the Democratic grassroots in District 30,” said Stewart. “We have built a strong, people-powered campaign that is now in position to take my message to Democratic and Unaffiliated voters and win the June primary.”

Under Colorado law, candidates participating in the assembly process must secure at least 30% of support from voting delegates in order to qualify for the ballot. Stewart received the most support at 58.5%. Her next closest opponent notched 33.5%.

“We can’t afford to slow down or take anything for granted,” said Stewart. “Working families are counting on leaders who are willing to do the work that will lower costs and make life better. That’s my Colorado promise.”

Stewart’s campaign has been endorsed by numerous current and former elected officials and Plumbers Local Union 3. She is also a Moms Demand Action Gun Sense candidate.

A board-certified music therapist, Lakewood Councilwoman Rebekah Stewart has spent nearly a decade as a Medicaid provider helping children and adults with disabilities, dementia and Alzheimer’s. Her work has always been about finding creative, effective solutions to help even the most vulnerable thrive. In 2021, Stewart was the first Lakewood city council candidate to oust an incumbent in over 16 years, winning by nearly 20 points to help form a new progressive council majority.
