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## **Dear Supporter of Toco Hills Community Alliance,**



As we start this new year of 2021, we reflect back on 2020, a year like no other, full of unexpected challenges. I am proud to say that at each turn, Toco Hills Community Alliance rose to the occasion. We are not merely surviving, but we are thriving, even in the midst of the COVID 19 pandemic.

First, just a snapshot of a few mind-boggling numbers to highlight the extreme nature of the year past:

- We served over twice as many people in 2020 as we did in 2019.
   In 2019, we served almost 30,000 people; in 2020, we served over 63,000 people.
- We served over 22,000 families in 2020.
- Those families were given almost 900,000 pounds of groceries.

The shadow of COVID required us to quickly and completely change our model of food distribution. In less than a week, we transitioned fully from distributing food basically like a grocery store to prepacking nutritionally balanced boxes of 40-50 pounds we distribute outside and directly into trunks of cars.

- The building is shut down to everyone except staff and volunteers on duty
- Everyone on the premises is required to be masked at all times
- Number of people on duty reduced to be able to maintain social distance
- Screenings of all staff and volunteers at the door
- Washing hands a lot!



When the pandemic first hit, we

also shut down both our Clothes Closet and hot lunches. We now hold the Clothes Closet on two Fridays a month, outside, weather permitting. We also now have a very small kitchen crew that cooks "to-go" meals for our volunteers and homeless friends.

In 2020, we saw improvements in our infrastructure to serve more effectively and efficiently, including:

- An electronic registration system for those we serve
- Upgrading of equipment
  - Electronic tablets so we can register people outside
  - Ten burner stove and all new kitchen utensils
  - Refrigerated van to pick up frozen and refrigerated foods

The majority of these improvements were made possible with grants, among those, from the Atlanta Community Food Bank, the Glenn Foundation, the Episcopal Community Foundation, the United Way, and the Dekalb County Commissioners.

And, then there is the miracle in the midst of it all: YOU, our

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We held our first Annual Campaign, expecting that we might

raise \$20,000; because of you all, we are on track to raise about three times that much.

- We saw a 75% increase in the amount of privately donated food – over 127,000 pounds!
- We have had support from more organizations than ever: faith communities, schools, Scout troops, private businesses.



I am so very amazed and humbled, that, in midst of a pandemic and all the associated economic fallout, we were able to meet the needs of our neighbors. We have continued to provide not just food and clothes, but also hope and hospitality, care and compassion, to hundreds of families, thousands of people, every single week.

To be clear: YOU have made this possible. Without your faithful support, we could not have done any of this. All of us together are truly living into our mission of being neighbors helping neighbors. And, this pandemic and its economic effects are not going away. There will continue to be high need for our services. Because we know we have your support, we will face the challenges of 2021 with courage.

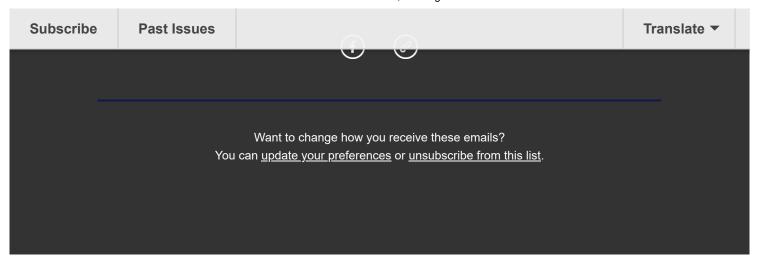
