As they all repacked their food so they could transport it, they shared items with one another – one didn't care for fish so gave it to another who loved it; one couldn't use all of the fruit so gave it to someone to share with another who couldn't make it that day. In the process, they made this new guy feel welcomed and demonstrated a generosity that we all would do well to emulate.


THCA Executive Director Rev. Dr. Lisa Heilig Please help us stock the pantry this holiday season.
