Dear Supporter of Toco Hills Community Alliance,





The Farm Bill is federal legislation that governs many nutrition and agriculture programs, and it is up for renewal in 2023. This legislation allocates



funding for The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) and the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP). Together, these programs help bridge the food gap for millions of families and individuals facing hunger across the country.

It is a bill that is renewed every 5 years, usually with broad bipartisan support. Throughout the month of August, lawmakers will be on recess. We encourage you to utilize this time period to reach out to your elected officials and connect with them.
