Overglaze Firings

A THIRD FIRING?

Did you know that ceramics can go through a third firing? This process is called "overglaze firing." In short, overglaze materials, such as lusters or overglaze decals, are applied on top of finished glazeware. To prevent the glaze underneath from becoming fluid again, overglaze must be fired at a lower temperature than bisqueware, around cone 018 (or about 1300 - 1350 degree Fahrenheit). If the glaze underneath softens and becomes fluid again, the effect of the overglaze may become sacrificed. Common frits used in cone 6 glazing melt at too high of a temperature to be used in overglaze firings, so as a replacement much more expensive frits that are high in bismuth are used. To apply materials to glaze and have them dry, the overglaze mixtures must be suspended in petroleum and solvents, noted in the strong smell that overglazes generally have. Community Kiln does not offer third, overglaze firings, but other shared kilns may fire to overglaze temperatures for an additional fee.

OVERGLAZE FIRING

Luster is an overglaze, meaning that it's applied over the vitrified, glaze-fired piece and requires a third firing. Luster is a material made from real metal along with an organic binder. The binder is burned away at a low temperature to leave behind only the metal. As the finished, lustered piece is used, harsh soaps can wear on the gold finish. Be careful with the finished results and remember, this is real metal! you pieces will no longer me microwave safe after applying luster.

Community Kiln is hosting a FREE luster firing workshop. Mandatory orientation will be held on Saturday, August 16th from 1–2PM to go over safety procedures and give more information for the actual luster firing. More information and RSVP on pages 3 and 14.

Luster Firing Saturday, August 16th 1-2PM


This FREE event was made possible by Framingham Cultural Council, Community Kiln and various independent donors.







Students ages 9 -12 will learn to create one of a kind ceramics using basic handbuilding techniques.

Tuition includes instruction, clay, glaze, underglazes, and firing. Each session meets for 5 weeks.

Teen Wheelthrowing

Thursday 4:15PM -6:15PM

Teens will learn the process of wheel throwing including centering, opening, pulling, and forming shapes such as bowls, vases and mugs. Tuition includes instruction, 25 lbs of clay, firing costs, underglazes and glazing. Each session meets for 5 weeks.

Throughout the week, kids will be presented with ceramic mini projects, collaborative pieces and games. Students are encouraged to pursue their creative interests, whether that be handbuilding or wheelthrowing. Class tuition includes daily instruction, underglaze, clay and firing. All finished pieces can be picked up at a later date.

Class takes place at our Framingham studio from 1PM to 4pm everyday for a week. We recommend that students attend all sessions — there will not be make up sessions available.

This is a pottery swap program hosted by Community Kiln. Bring something that you are proud of and would be happy to receive.

This event will be held on Friday, August 15th at 6PM. Everyone will bring one piece of pottery (valued \$25-\$50) that they have made themselves to be traded. We ask that you do not bring "seconds" or anything that has been collecting dust.

Once everyone has arrived, we will stand in a circle and move the pots to the left and right, following the instructed prompts. If you are a representative for yourself and another person, you can hold a pot in your left hand and one in your right hand. Once the prompts finish, that if your pot to take home!

Unsatisfied with your pot? Everyone who wants to give trading one more go can make another circle and be instructed to follow the prompts again. Once this circle is done, that is your final pot. There will not be a third round of trading.
