


Meet our Summer Intern!

Q: Where are you from and how does that affect your work?

I am from Clare County, Michigan. Because I grew up near the great lakes, emotional connection to land is something that I've been exploring recently. I went back for the first time in a decade and revisited what I considered "home," which pushed me to explore how that makes me feel; Fish have become a more frequent and greater metaphor in my work because of that.



Both of my parents worked in 3D mediums. My dad made wood carved guitars and my mom was a fibers artist for 30 years. My aunt introduced me to ceramics specifically, gifting me a pottery wheel on my 18th birthday since she had a small test kiln for me to use!

Summer Reminders

YOU'LL NEED TO KNOW THIS!

As we approach Summer 2025, read through the following reminders to stay "in the know."

- Kilns run on a limited scheudle during the hotter months. If the temperature is above 80 degrees Fahrenheit, one kiln may be run. Above 90 degrees, no kilns may be run.
- Because of our abbreviated Summer schedule, students are limited to 50lbs of clay per semester. If you are enrolled in Summer 1 and Summer 2, you will be limited to ONE free bag and can purchase 3 more bags for all 10 weeks of class (4 total)
- Stay cool, and be conscious of how much kiln space you're using! Now might not be the time to make a 22 inch tall vase or platter the width of the kiln. Consider saving these projects for cooler months.



We are so pleased to offer our first technical series "Handbuilding for Wheelthrowers." Each Friday in June will feature a different handbuilding technique that students, who are primarily wheelthrowers, can learn and incorporate into their artistic practices. We will offer four different classes: Coil, Slab, Extruder and Pinching.

Instructors Amy Snyder and Meghan Albee are excited to bring you their favorite tips and tricks to help you master different handbuilding techniques. Amy says, "I'm excited to teach handbuilding techniques to Community Kiln's wonderful wheel-throwers! We are aiming for informative, action packed sessions with lots of opportunity for fun and collaboration." Students are encouraged to bring their own tools and clay to practice the demonstrated techniques and better envision how to use handbuilding in conjunction with wheelthrown works.

If you are interested in registering for any of these sessions, simply log in through your student account and select the class you would like to attend. Each session is \$35 and includes instructor demonstrations.

Fairy House Workshop





Students ages 9 -12 will learn to create one of a kind ceramics using basic handbuilding techniques.

Tuition includes instruction, clay, glaze, underglazes, and firing. Each session meets for 5 weeks.

Teens will learn the process of wheel throwing including centering, opening, pulling, and forming shapes such as bowls, vases and mugs. Tuition includes instruction, 25 lbs of clay, firing costs, underglazes and glazing. Each session meets for 5 weeks.

Throughout the week, kids will be presented with ceramic mini projects, collaborative pieces and games.
