

NOTES FROM THE TECHNICIANS

As winter creeps in we start to see a lot of people who haven't used their heater all year, start their heater up only to smell like somethings burning throughout their home. When your furnace is not used for long periods of time, dust can collect on the heat exchanger and in the air ducts. When the furnace is turned on, the dust burns off and releases an odor.
