## MINISTERS DELINQUENT DUES POLICY LAST UPDATED:

## 2/6/2024

Whereas it has become necessary for our District to formalize our policies in regards to the basic tenants of our organization- the United Pentecostal Church International.

And Whereas; it is only in complete accord and unity with our Ministerial Organization that we as ministers of the Gospel also abide by financial and ethical standards of conduct, so as to maintain a testimony, free of blame and any false accusation of misconduct. As we hold the saints of the Lord responsible for their faithful tithing and support of our local assemblies. We should also with a more ready mind be willing to hold ourselves accountable through our faithful support of our District and the larger UPCI family.

Be it resolved that a policy for the ethical and fair treatment of all ministers in the Colorado District of the United Pentecostal Church International be formally established so as to hinder any favoritism and special treatment to any minister who is not in compliance with the financial plan of the Colorado District of the UPCI.

This policy sets forth the procedure for the rectification of delinquent unpaid ministerial dues by any minister: local, general, or ordained. Giving the District Superintendent and District Board the latitude to offer special terms for the catching up of said dues.

Therefore; be it resolved that The District Secretary-Treasurer will send a official letter via email to any licensed minister that is more than 120 days delinquent on his or her district ministerial dues/tithes.

Further that this correspondence will give thirty days to get caught up on any delinquent dues or arrangements for payment to be made within 120 days of notification via District Superintendent and/or Secretary.

Therefore; be it further resolved that If these straight forward terms are not met, said minister's credentials and license may be dropped. Additionally, if behind in dues from previous year(s) they will not be able to vote at the current District Conference or any special or sectional meetings until said dues are caught up, subject to the decision of the District Superintendent and District Board and in accord with the manual of the United Pentecostal Church International.
