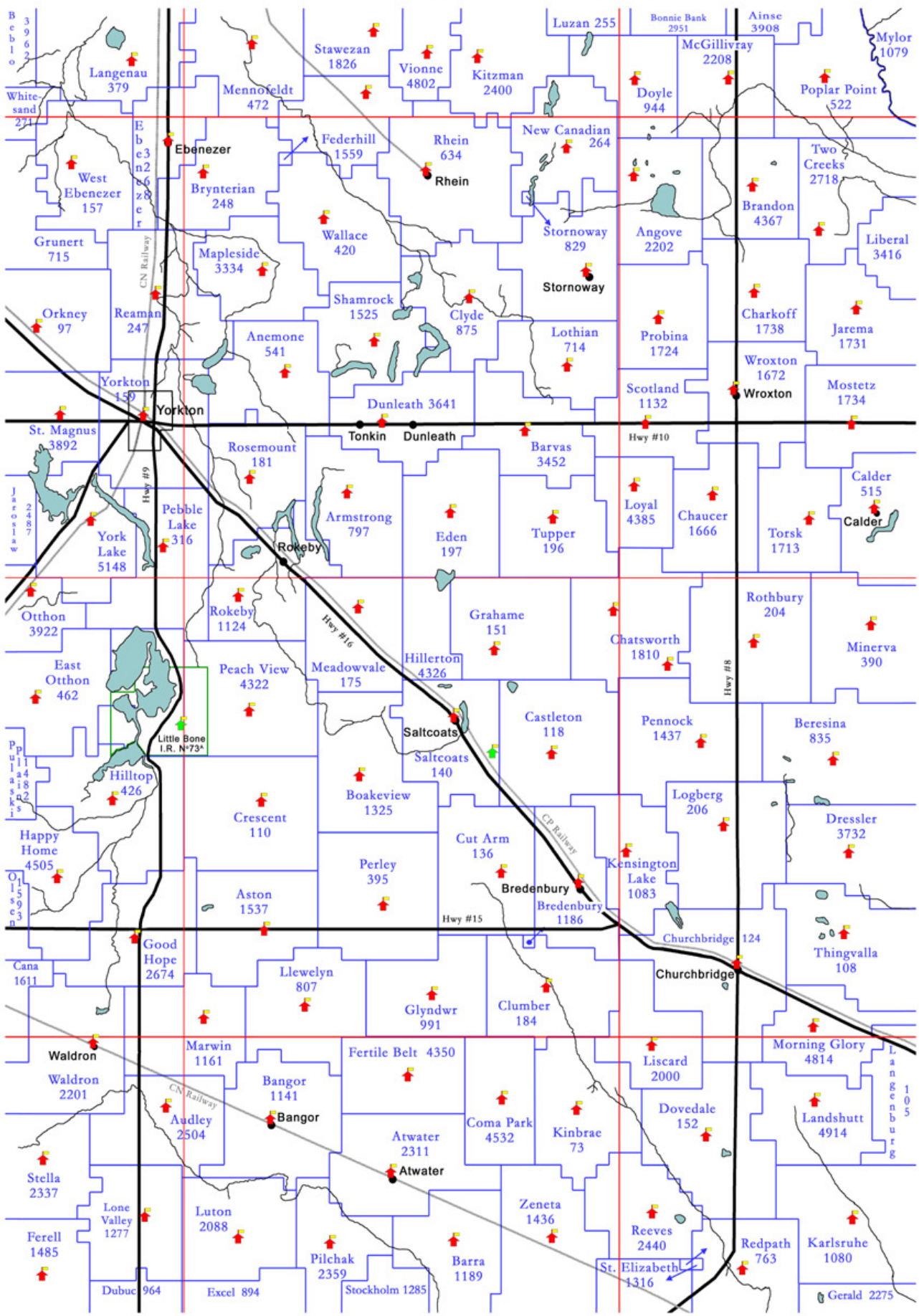
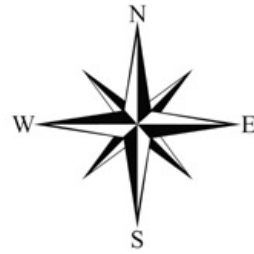


# AREA SCHOOL DISTRICTS

from the late 1800s to the mid 1900s

Highways and Railroads, as marked, are current 2019 names and numbers.

RM (Rural Municipality) boundaries are approximations.

Cities, towns and villages are existing as of 2019.

SD refers to School District.

School house icons are positioned as close to their last known location as possible.

We express our indebtedness to the Provincial Archives of Saskatchewan for their assistance in providing a map showing area school district boundaries circa 1918, answers to many questions, and a listing of the last known site of area school houses.

Several local history books record the story of school districts. Family records and histories often identify locations and events by school districts.

Few maps exist to identify school boundaries, and today the boundaries and districts themselves no longer exist.

The term school house was used to refer to the buildings used for classroom instruction, not the teacherages or small houses built by some districts to provide accommodation for teachers.

The Saskatchewan One Room Schoolhouse Project has also been a source of information and has photos of many of the schools.
