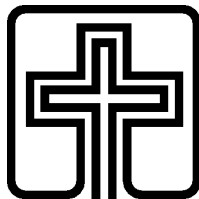

WE ARE REVIEWING our mission giving in preparation for our 2023 budget. If you have any suggestions for ministries that should be included in our giving or any suggested changes in our current giving, please talk to a Church Council member or Pastor David.

WE SUPPORT CHRIST'S MISSION beyond our congregation by giving 31 percent of regular (undesigned) offerings to ministries beyond Immanuel. 7 percent of our offerings are given to the North American Lutheran Church, our church body. 3 percent supports the NALC Theological Education Fund and the North American Lutheran Seminary. One percent each supports Pastor Valery Hryhoryk, an NALC missionary in Belarus, and Pastor Charles and Anita Jackson, NALC missionaries now serving the World Mission Prayer League in Canada. 1 percent each goes to two NALC mission congregations: Emmanuel Lutheran in Rochester, Minn., and Genesis Lutheran in Piedmont, S.D. The remaining 17 percent is divided between: Bella Pregnancy Center, China Service Ventures, Churches Care for Whitewood, Friends of Madagascar Mission, Global Health Ministries, Love INC (Sturgis), Lutheran CORE, Lutheran World Relief, Lutherans Outdoors in South Dakota, NALC Disaster Response, NALC Great Commission Fund, NALC Western Dakotas, Montana, Wyoming Mission District, St. Dymas Prison Congregations, Salvation Army (Northern Hills), Society of St. Vincent De Paul (Northern Hills), Water Mission, Whitewood Food Pantry, and our Special Local Mission Fund.

OUR MISSION OF THE MONTH is NALC Disaster Response, the disaster response ministry of the North American Lutheran Church. NALC Disaster Response works primarily with and through local congregations to assist those in their area impacted by disasters. NALC Disaster Response provides funds to respond rapidly when domestic natural disasters occur, alleviate human suffering, provide transitional assistance, and enable those affected to begin the rebuilding process. NALC Disaster Response also helps congregations and mission districts prepare for disasters. Disaster Response warehouses gather supplies to have materials ready when disasters strike.
