INTERNATIONAL DAY OF PRAYER for the Persecuted Church is today. The persecution of Christians is ongoing globally, with more than 380 million facing high levels of persecution and discrimination. One in every 7 Christians worldwide are persecuted. This includes violence, imprisonment, and systemic discrimination, often occurring in countries in Africa and Asia where governments may favor a state religion or discriminate against religious minorities. BOOKS AND CULTURE DISCUSSION GROUP is a group that meets monthly at Immanuel to discuss recent important "secular" books that have broad cultural significance and consider their implications from a Christian perspective and biblical worldview. Please read the selected book to prepare for discussion with the group. The book to be read for the November meeting is: Return of the Strong Gods: Nationalism, Populism, and the Future of the West by R. R. Reno. The postwar consensus of openness and fear of fascism as a reaction to the horrendous events of two world wars has resulted in the loss of social solidarity. Our response to the dissolution of our previous attachments to nation, other people, and religion will determine the future of Western civilization. The book is available from local bookstores and online. The group meets monthly and selects a book to be read for discussion. The next meeting is at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 25. WE ARE REVIEWING our mission giving in preparation for our 2026 budget. You can see our current mission giving in last year's annual report. If you have any suggestions for ministries that should be included in our giving or any suggested changes in our current giving, please talk to a Church Council member or Pastor David.

OUR MISSION OF THE MONTH is Churches Care for Whitewood. Churches Care for Whitewood is a cooperative effort of the three churches of Whitewood to care for those in need in the Whitewood area. We provide emergency aid to individuals and families and hope to provide ongoing support and education to help them make good decisions for their future. Churches Care oversees the ministry of the Whitewood Food Pantry. Churches Care provides grocery gift cards for Thanksgiving and Christmas for families in need that are selected by the social worker at the Whitewood Elementary School. Mission of the Month highlights one of the ministries supported through your regular giving to Immanuel.

WHITEWOOD ELEMENTARY SCHOOL is facing significant cuts due to financial shortfalls in the Meade School District. Whitewood community leaders are trying to raise funds to help ensure the continuation of the Whitewood Elementary School. They are creating a fund or foundation that will provide ongoing restricted support for the school. They are working with Meade School District officials to determine the amount of annual support needed and the guarantees that can be obtained from the district. Details are still in process, but requests for funds are being made to people in the Whitewood area and to the churches of Whitewood.
