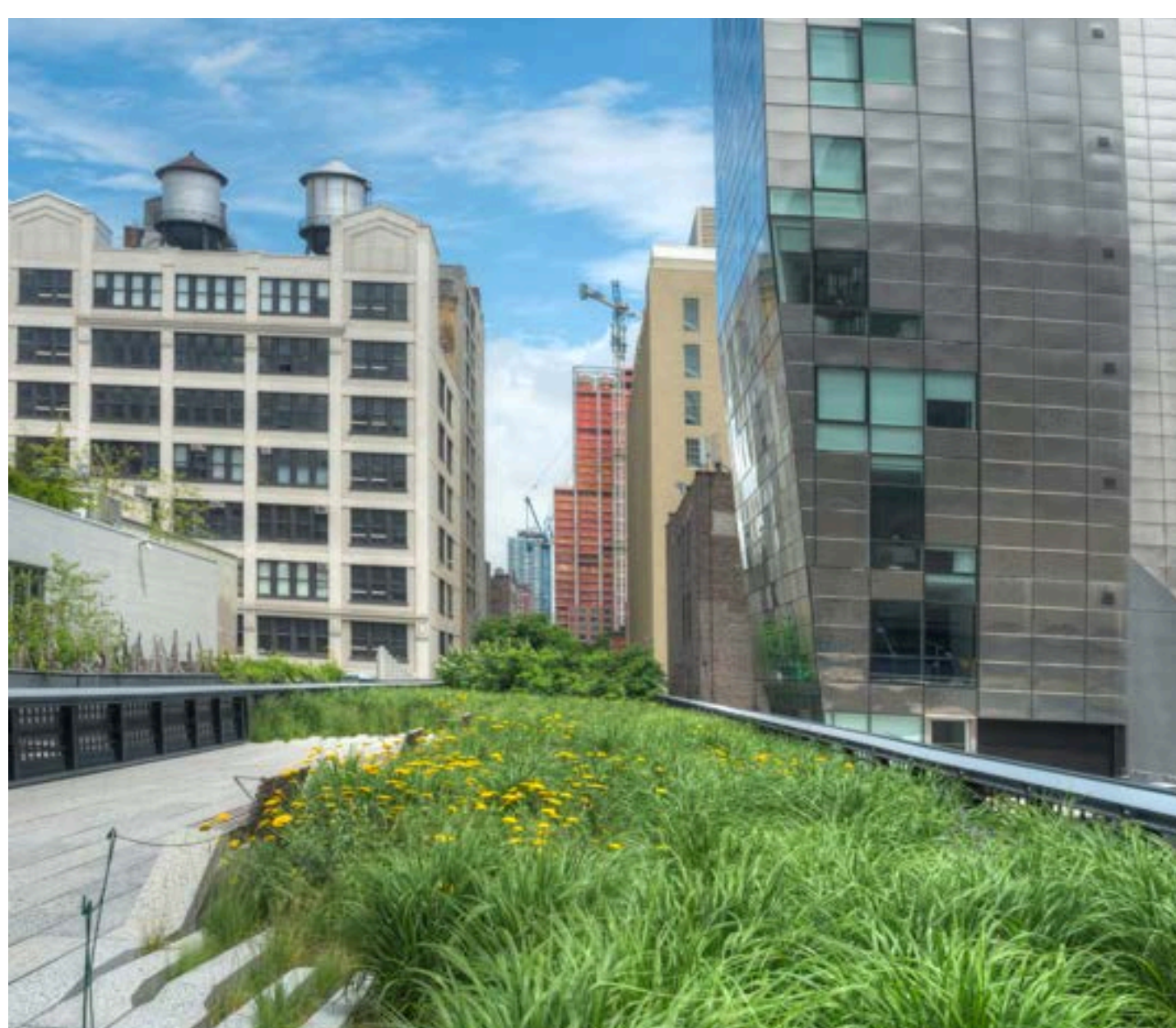
CENTRAL PARK

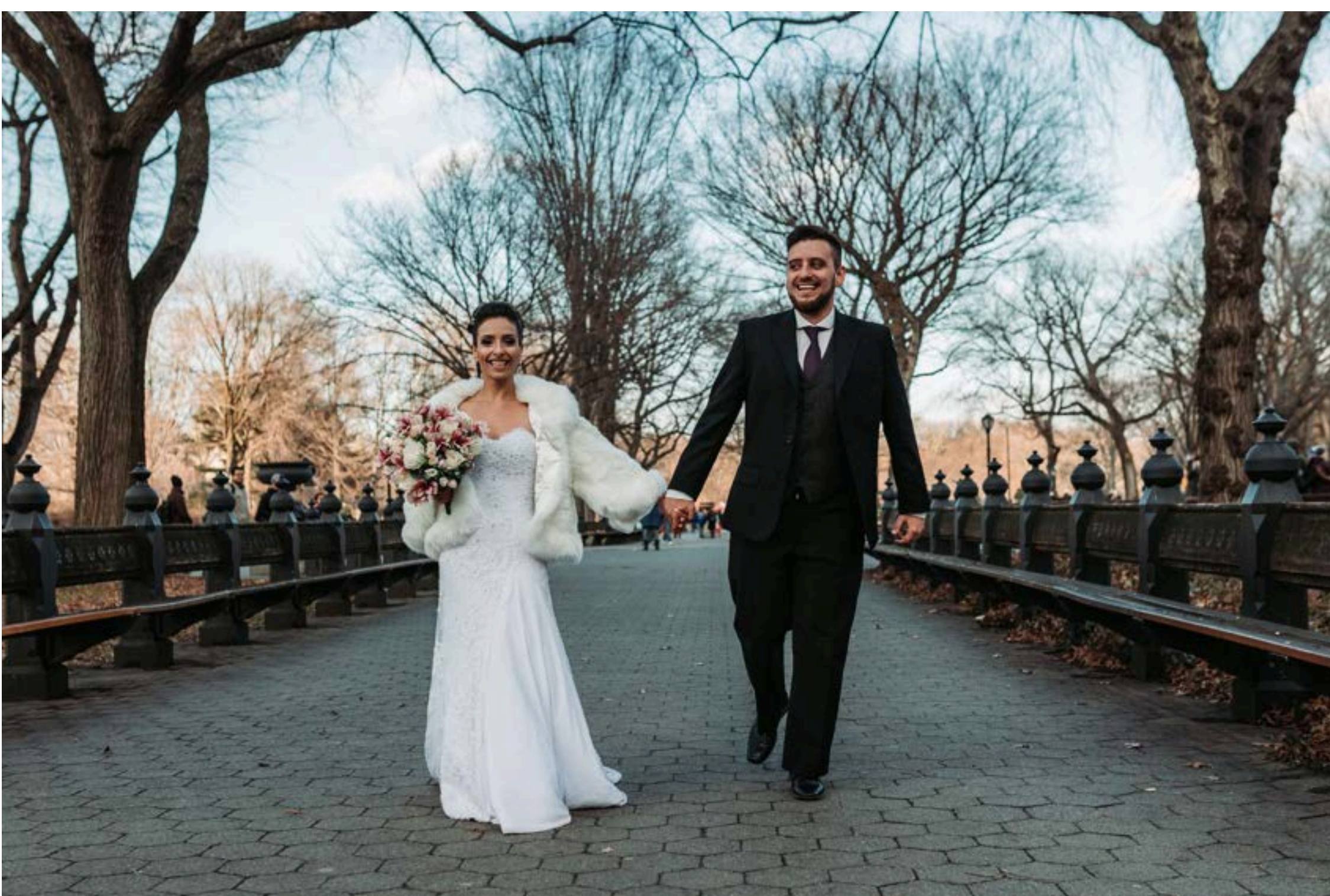

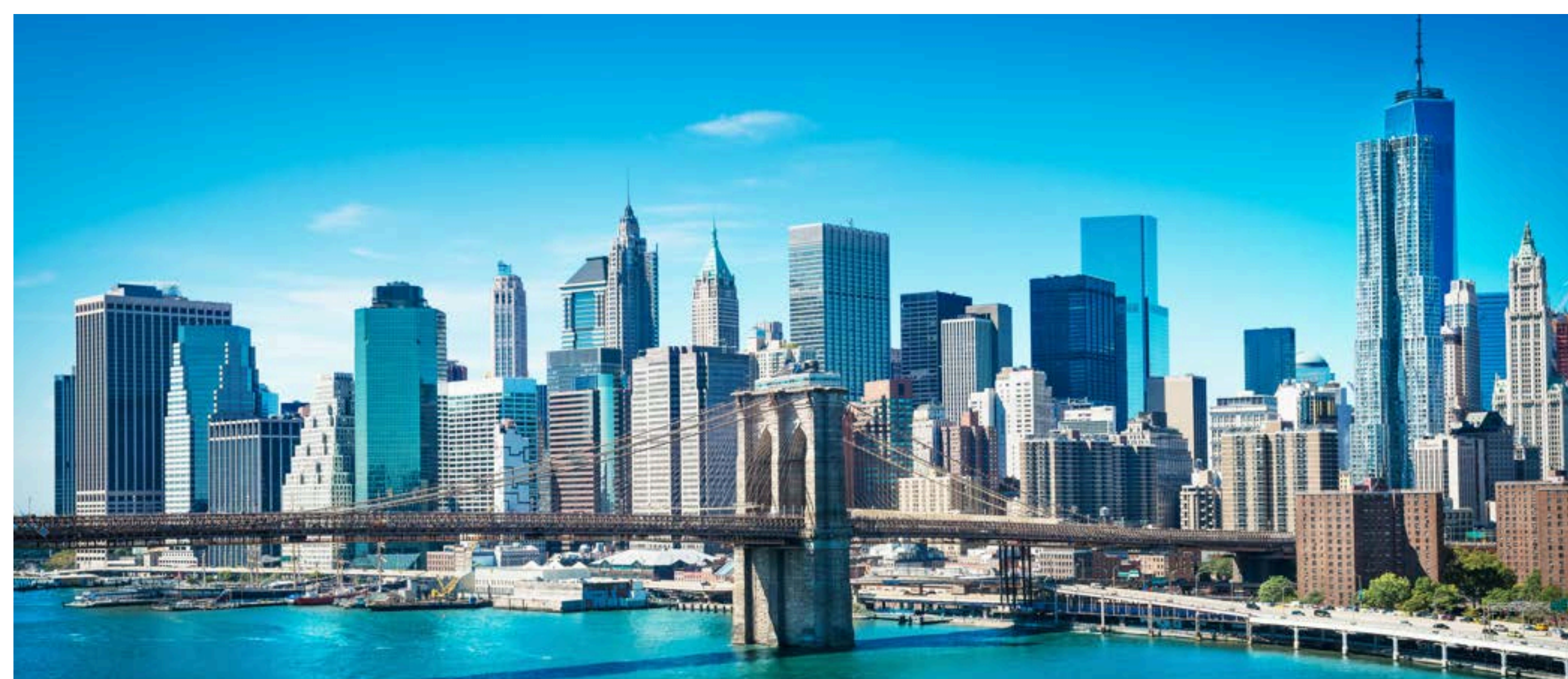


05 BE MINDFUL OF REFLECTIONS
