

## Black Women and Breast Cancer Facts and Figures

Black women had higher rates of screening mammography than other women compared to only 20% of White patients.\*\*\*

In 2025, about 4[] 53[] new cases of breast cancer are expected to occur among Black women. \*\*\*

Black women are **Any** more likely to die from breast cancer than women of any other racial or ethnic group.\*

Black women are diagnosed at TWO TIMES the rate of White women and die at 3 TIMFS the rate. \*\*

In 2025, about breast cancer deaths are expected to occur among Black women.\*\*\*

## **BLACK WOMEN ARE MORE LIKELY**

- Get diagnosed with breast cancer before age 40
- Have certain aggressive breast cancers
- Have obesity and other health conditions
- Get diagnosed with advanced (metastatic) breast cancer

Black women have a

lower breast cancer incidence than White women, but

higher mortality, largely due to later diagnosis and less access to high-quality treatment.\*\*

**5-YFAR** survival is 81% for Black women vs. 91% for white women.\*\*

Black women are less likely to be diagnosed with localized-stage breast cancer and most likely to be diagnosed with distant stage or unstaged cancer contributing to the disproportionate mortality.\*\*

Black women have an increased risk of earlyonset breast cancer.\*\*\*

HR+/HER2-BREAST CANCER is the most common subtype in every racial group, with the lowest in Black women (59%) as compared to White women

Triple Negative **Breast Cancer** accounts for

cases in Black women versus

cases for all other ethnic groups.\*\*

About of Black women will be diagnosed during their lifetime.\*\*\*

Black women are two times as likely to be diagnosed with Triple-negative breast cancer as compared to White women and My more likely to die from these tumors. Triple-negative is a generally more aggressive with higher risk of metastasis and recurrence, in part because it lacks the biomarkers for targeted treatment.\*\*
