



In an age of urgency and disruption, we often look to bold gestures and loud voices to catalyze change. But what if some of the most powerful forms of activism are quiet, persistent, and deeply embodied? In this keynote, we'll explore the concept of Quiet Activism—a mode of architectural practice grounded in intention, integrity, and sustained commitment to social and environmental justice. Drawing a parallel to seed savers—whose quietly subversive acts of growing, harvesting, and sharing offer a radical reimagining of food systems—she will reflect on how architecture, too, can be a vehicle for transformation, not through spectacle, but through steady, purposeful work.

Anne will share how Mahlum has embraced this ethos, beginning with clear goals rooted in equity and sustainability, then cultivating practices that align design with deeper values. From vision-setting and collective staff engagement to project examples that manifest these commitments, she'll illustrate how small, consistent acts can shape systems and communities over time. Together, we'll consider how architecture's tangible interventions—spaces, materials, rituals—can serve as quiet, yet potent acts of resistance and care. This talk invites a reframing: to see quiet not as absence, but as a fertile ground for agency and radical potential.

Inder his guidance as a Founding Principal of KieranTImberlake, the firm has received over 260 design citations, including the AIA Firm Award in 2008 and the Cooper-Hewitt National Design Award in 2010. Steve and co-founder James Timberlake were the inaugural recipients of the Benjamin Latrobe Fellowship for architectural design research from the AIA College of Fellows in 2001. Since 2002, they have co-

authored seven books on architecture, including the influential book <u>refabricating Architecture</u> and their newest monograph, <u>KieranTimberlake: Fullness</u>.

Frances has worked on more than 50 college campuses across the country as an award-winning designer, in a design advisory role, as a faculty member, and as dean of the architecture school at Pratt Institute. NYC AIA. Her research papers on campus design have been published in The Chronicle of Higher Education and Places Journal. In 2023, Frances became the 61st Chancellor of the AIA's College of Fellows.

In 2007, Leers Weinzapfel Associates became the first woman-owned firm in America to receive the prestigious AIA Firm Award, and it has been included on ARCHITECT magazine's "Top 50" US firms roster since 2015. Parallel with her practice, Andrea is a former director of the

Master in Urban Design Program at the Harvard Graduate School of Design, where she was adjunct professor in Architecture and Urban Design, and she now serves on the university's Design Advisory Pool. Her previous appointments include Yale University, the University of Pennsylvania, and the University of Virginia. Internationally, she has taught at Tokyo Institute of Technology, National Chiao Tung University in Taiwan, and the University of Paris, Sorbonne. She was a Visiting Artist at the American Academy in Rome and lectures and participates in symposia and design juries throughout the United States, Europe, and Asia. Andrea's work earned her the Boston Society of Architects Award of Honor, and she was Commissioner for the Mayor's Boston Civic Design Commission.

Senior Principal, Director of Design, Mahlum Architects Seattle, WA


As a Senior Design Principal and Director of Design at Mahlum Architects, based in Seattle and Portland, Anne has made a lasting impact on the architectural landscape of the Pacific Northwest through her dedication to sustainable design. She has worked across a diverse range of sectors, including education, healthcare, housing, and commercial mixed-use. Under her leadership, Mahlum has received five Top Ten COTE Green Project awards from the AIA Committee on the Environment, as well as more than 100 AIA and IIDA design awards at both regional and national levels.

Throughout her career, Anne has crafted spaces defined by an elemental sense of materiality, infused with natural light, and deeply connected to their surroundings. This sensitive and often understated collection of spaces reflects a poetic respect for nature, skillfully employing light, air, seasonal changes, and weathering to heighten occupants' awareness of and connection to the natural world.

Anne is a dedicated advocate for design excellence and an active participant in fostering meaningful design dialogue through professional engagement at the national, regional, and local levels. She has served on the AIA National Committee on the Environment (COTE) Advisory Group and the Committee on Design (COD) Advisory Group, where she chaired in 2011 and led Honorary FAIA nominations. She is a frequent juror for prestigious awards programs, including AIA Fellowship, AIA COTE Top Ten Green Projects, AIA Academy of Architecture for Health (AAH) Healthcare Design Awards, and the 2009 AIA National Honor Awards for Architecture.

A Fellow of the American Institute of Architects since 2007, Anne remains actively involved with AIA Seattle, where she served as President in 2010. She also participates in studio reviews at the University of Washington School of Architecture and frequently speaks at regional and national conferences on integrated design. Anne graduated with honors from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute with degrees in Architecture and Civil Engineering and currently serves on the School of Architecture's Dean Leadership Council.

Her work has ranged from residential and commercial hyper-efficiency and passive house retrofits to public realm and social impact projects. Prior to FNA, she was Director of Sustainability and a Senior Associate at WXY architecture + urban design in NYC. She has co-led several projects for WXY with NYCHH, NYCHA, NYPA, NYSOPRHP, Liberty State Park, NJ and Chester Agricultural Center farmworker housing.

Julie has over 25 years working in NYC construction industry on a range of projects and specializes in energy-efficiency retrofitting and new construction. She was the architect on the first certified Passive House project in NYC in 2012 which won an International Passive House Design Award and she wrote a book titled The Greenest Home, Superinsulated and Passive House Design with 18 case studies. and has since led passive house strategy projects in NYC, Seattle, and Atlanta.

Torres Moskovitz is active in the community and is an appointed public member of Brooklyn Community Board 1's Environmental Protection Committee and on the Advisory Boards of both Street Vendor Project and Youth Design Center. She is a Director on the Board of Directors at Brooklyn AIA. She also teaches at various universities such as NYU, Pratt, Parsons, Syracuse University, and RISD.

Julie is a licensed architect in NY, NJ, CT, PA, WA, OH, and GA and is NCARB-certified. She is also an Owner's Representative, Sustainability consultant, Certified Passive House Consultant, Certified Passive House Tradesman in Building Envelope, and LEED AP, WELL AP and a Regenerative Design Practitioner.


