Designing for Justice, Dignity, Belonging and Persistence

In the wake of multiple pandemics impacting societal and environmental challenges, we came together to grapple with the resultant shifts and compounding disruptions that have challenged how we live, work, and thrive. At this inflection point, we have had to quickly pivot to rapidly adapt our professional practice and processes to serve the needs of our clients and community members. The J.E.D.I. Agenda introduces a **Justice** and Equity-driven approach to drive Diverse representation and Inclusive results at the contextual intersections of Social/Economic, Environmental, and Health, and Practice. Together, we can co-create an intersectional "Roadmap for Action" designed to quide practitioners and firm leaders in their commitments to initiating and sustaining change by dismantling systems of harm and oppression. Together, we will explore a new paradigm for designing a just future in which the built environment cultivates dignity, belonging, agency and mutualism. During the 2021/2022 Equity by Design J.E.D.I. agenda practices and explorations series, we have started to draw the connections of the intersectional determinants of our ability to thrive: Social/Economic, Physical/ Mental Health, and Environment / Geography. These conditions are compounded by systems of injustice - racism, sexism/misogyny and other forms of discrimination that have systems impacts to vulnerable populations including poverty, access, social mobility, health, and environmental threats. The discussion will focus on actions needed for

sustained progress in dismantling systems of harm and oppression.

Robert has had a life-long fascination with interaction of natural and the manmade. Humane architecture refers to an approach to design and construction that places emphasis on the well-being of both nature and human beings. It seeks to create built environments that harmoniously integrate with the natural surroundings while also promoting the physical, psychological, and social well-being of individuals and communities. Humane modern architecture integrates elements such as natural

lighting, ventilation, and green spaces to enhance occupant comfort and health, fosters social interaction and community engagement, and embraces sustainable practices to minimize environmental impact. Robert ultimately aims to strike a balance between the build environment and natural world, recognizing the interconnectedness and interdependence between the two. This talk will explore these influences on his body of work and insights gained over 35 years of practice.

Rosa T. Sheng, FAIA, LEED AP BD+C Vice President, Smith Group, California

President at SmithGroup serving multiple roles as Higher Education Studio Leader in Northern California and national Director of Justice, Equity, Diversity, Inclusion. She is also the founder of Equity by Design [EQxD] and the first Asian American Women to serve as AIA San Francisco President (2018) in the organization's 136 year history. Recognized as a designer, architect,

strategist and thought leader, she is known for delivering design solutions with transformational impact in the built environment. When asked "What type of Architecture do you do?" Her answer, "The kind that's never been done before."


This mindset has resulted in a variety of award-winning and internationally acclaimed projects including the aesthetically minimal, highly technical glass structures for Apple's original high-profile retail stores - revolutionary workplace of the future in the Pixar Animation Studios Steven P. Jobs Building - and current work to advance equitable and sustainable design solutions for institutions of higher learning in California. These include the UC Davis Teaching and Learning Complex, Lorry I. Lokey Graduate School of Business at Mills College / Northeastern, as well as STEM projects for the California State University system and Community Colleges to advance underrepresented student in academic persistence and future ready resilience.

Rosa has presented her work both nationally and overseas including "Why Equity Matters for Everyone: A New Value Proposition for Architecture" and in 2020 - The J.E.D.I. Agenda - An Intersectional Approach to Designing a Just Future". In 2019, Rosa was honored by Metropolis Game Changer. Additionally, she has been featured in Architect Magazine, Architectural Record, The Wall Street Journal, The New York Times including talks at Harvard GSD, Stanford University, SxSW, TEDxPhiladelphia, KQED/NPR and the Cannes Lions Festival.

About Equity by Design [EQxD]

Fueled by persistent gender and racial inequity that has perpetuated the lack of representation in the architectural profession, Rosa founded Equity by Design in 2013, then continued her advocacy as a Board of Director and subsequently the 2018 President of the American Institute of Architects San Francisco. Her efforts have greatly contributed to a national movement to advance Justice, Equity, Diversity and Inclusion in professional practice and the design outcomes in the built environment for underserved communities. Equity by Design initiated 3 major research projects to identify "Pinch Points"

- the challenges and barriers to leadership advancement. The 2018 Equity in Architecture Survey resulting in nearly 15,000 respondents has catalyzed similar surveys in Engineering and Construction industries. The resulting efforts have initiated advocacy and activism to advance underrepresented identities in architecture – including women, black, indigenous, and people of color – in order to retain talent, advance the profession and communicate the value of justice, equity, diversity and inclusion in designing to our communities.

In 2022 Robert established the firm of Robert Miller FAIA Architects LLC with a mission of furthering his personal interests in projects that excel in design and innovation. His creativity is fueled by variety of scales, inspiring products, residences, and large urban interventions. Embracing the lessons and tools developed

through recent years of remote work, RMFAIA invested in a fresh look at the future process of architecture. Robert embodies an unusual combination of intellectual and visceral fascinations with the place, people, and details in evolving a new era of architecture. The thoughtful and intense approach yields a seemingly inevitable aesthetic, expressive of the details, materials, and experience of the user. The architecture recognizes a desire for efficiency while distilling the thoughtful humane modernism that has driven his decades of work.

Prior to opening RMFAIA, Robert pioneered Bohlin Cywinski Jackson's Seattle office over 30 years ago. Robert continues to work closely with BCJ as a consultant on special projects including iconic mixed-use high rises nationally and internationally. His lifelong interests in social issues, alternative construction, renewable energy, and industrial design are reflected in his holistic approach to architecture, ranging broadly in scale from modest cabins to high-rise towers. He believes strongly that thoughtful innovation and integration are the future of successful sustainable design. He is determined that ample budgets do not exempt a project from optimizing the use of resources, nor do modest budgets relieve one of the responsibilities for excellence in architecture and sustainability.

Robert's inventive and carefully crafted body of work includes the Pacific Rim Estate, Gosline Residence, Ballard Library, SOMA Towers, Uniqlo Shanghai, Lightbox, Tsing Tao Pearl Visitor Center, and Margalit Startup City, both New York and Israel, to mention a few. He enjoys establishing close collaborations with partner firms on large and complex projects. His creative solutions include innovative construction systems, furniture, hardware, and public art. Recognized with over 150 national and international awards, and widely published, Robert routinely shares his expertise through lectures, university reviews, and design award juries nationally and internationally. He credits his intense curiosity to his ability to consistently find unique opportunities and a thoughtful balance between the man-made and the natural for each project's circumstance.



Hala Barakat, Assistant Professor of Architecture, Univ of Idaho

Hala Barakat, originally from Anabta, Palestine is currently an assistant professor of Architecture at The university of Idaho. She holds an M.ARCH and MUCD degrees from the University of South Florida. Hala's work challenges the sleights, the injustices, and the outright failures that architecture has perpetuated over time by suppressing marginalized populations in favor of majoritarian agendas. She believes in architecture's ability to uncover hidden narratives of

deracination and resists the use of architecture to serve any political agenda. Hala is working on a book chapter, Architectures of Hiding: Crafting Concealment, Omission, Deception, Erasure, Silence for her work: A New Approach to Unveiling Hidden History and was recently offered the fellowship to the 2023 Architecture Residency program at Art Omi.



Andrew C. Erstad, AIA, Founding Partner, Erstad Architects

Andrew (Andy) Erstad is motivated and inspired by family, friends, and the community at large.

Andy founded erstad in 1998. Maintaining a 21-person firm with projects throughout the western U.S. region is Andy's primary focus; followed by his passionate, non-compensated public service. He designs projects that enrich quality of life and improve the surrounding environment through thoughtful and sustainable design.

Andy's architectural knowledge and sensibilities guide all efforts when he serves on non-profit boards and in roles appointed by Idaho Mayors including Zoning Ordinance Rewrite and Design Review Committees, Building Code Councils, Development Services Advisory Committee, and additional jurisdiction services related to developing design district standards, and municipal signage standards.

Andy annually participates on multiple volunteer boards, task forces, and oversight committees for medical institutions, civic organizations, and the Idaho Chapter of AIA, for which he helped establish a weekly Legislative Update which is emailed to AIA members statewide during Idaho's Legislative session. He is currently serving as President of the Idaho Chapter.

Fundamental to AIA's future growth is the education of the next generation of architects. To this end, Andy supports AIA and architectural education through the endowment of five architecture academic scholarships at three institutions in two states. He invests in creating and enhancing awareness for the architecture community by endowing scholarships for students pursuing architecture degrees, providing critiques, mentorships, and internships. In 2019, Andy initiated an annual gathering of the University of Idaho, College of Art and Architecture alumni groups to encourage his peers to become architecture scholarship donors and collectively promote architecture as a profession.


