Ivana Bošnjak Volda (1983) graduated from the Graphic Department of the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb and completed animation studies at the Norwegian University of Volda. She graduated with the film Crossed Shield, shot in collaboration with Lea Vidaković. With partner Thomas Johnson Volda, she shot two puppet films produced by Bonobostudio, Simulacra (2014) and Breathed Life (2019). These films were screened at numerous international festivals and won several awards. Ivana professionally participated in various stop-motion animation projects throughout Europe and led animation workshops for children and students. Filmography: Remember how I rode a white horse (2022), Inhaled life (2010, graduate film, co-authored with Lea Vidaković).

Thomas Johnson Volda (Bath, England, 1984) completed the study of weather media at the Institute of Welsh University in Cardiff, and graduated from the Department of New Media at the Academy of Fine Arts in Zagreb. With his partner Ivana Bošnjak Volda, he shot two puppet films, Simulacra (2014) and Inhaled Life (2019) in the production of Bonobostudio. Synopsis:

The plot follows Natali, who left the former Yugoslavia immediately after the beginning of the wars of the 1990s. Like many other people from this area, she emigrated abroad in search of a better life and a more secure future. After several years spent abroad, wanting to fully adapt to life in a new environment, she wished to change her identity and erase her origins. An unusual legal case regarding the inheritance of a rich elderly woman who did not have a family will bring her back to her country of origin, Montenegro.



Senad Šahmanović was born in Montenegro, in 1982. He studied at the Faculty of Drama Arts in Cetinje and Academy of Performing Arts (department Film and TV directing) at the University of Sarajevo. His short film, Tranquility of Blood who premiered at the Tampere International film festival, was screened so far in more than 40 international film festivals (Busan, Sarajevo, Odense, DokuFest) and won several awards (Grand Prix in Drama International Film Festival 2015). He also directed the short fiction "The Road" (2017), and a TV docu series of 12 episodes on Montenegrin writers (2018-2020). He was selected for Berlinale Talents in 2019.

Una Gunjak was born and raised in Sarajevo. She studied in Italy and then in the UK, graduating as editor from the National Film and TV School. Previously, Una has extensively worked as drama and documentary editor and has occasionally directed commercials. Her short film THE CHICKEN, aside from winning last years' Heart of Sarajevo', also won the EFA Award for Best European Short, after premiering in Critics' Week 2014. It has been screened at more than 150 festivals including Sundance Film Festival and New Director, New Films. Una Gunjak is currently developing her first feature as part of the Cannes Cinefondation Residence.

This year it is our great pleasure to host the Montenegrin premiere of Lady in Black, a short film by Gana Čomagić and screening of Boiling, a short film by Luka Dikanović.

Longline:

A conflicted funeral director enthusiastically tackles a large influx of customers during a new pandemic, along with their scrutiny of his career and fatherhood.



Gana Čomagić was born in Montenegro in 1991, and was raised in Podgorica and Zurich. A writer, director, and producer, she holds a MA in documentary film from the University of Sussex. She heads Evil Ideas, a Montenegro-based production company. Her short film Crna Dama (Lady in Black, 2023), a blend of black comedy and drama, recently had its premiere at FEST – New Directors New Films Festival in Espinho, Portugal. Čomagić is currently working on multiple short and feature-length projects in Montenegro and abroad. She is a member of the European Film Academy.

Synopsis:

In the poverty-stricken favelas of Rio de Janeiro in the 1970s, two young men choose different paths. Rocket is a budding photographer who documents the increasing drug-related violence of his neighborhood, while José "Zé" Pequeno is an ambitious drug dealer diving into a dangerous life of crime.



Fernando Meirelles was born in São Paulo, Brazil. While studying architecture at the University of São Paulo, he began to develop an interest in filmmaking. Along with a group of friends, he produced experimental videos. They formed a company called Olhar Electrônico, and the team became well known after winning awards at Brazilian film festivals.

Later when he began working in celluloid film, in the early '90s, together with Paulo Morelli and Andrea Barata Ribeiro, he opened the 02 Filmes production company.

After almost a decade of filming and winning award, a friend gave him the novel City of God to read with the idea that he would turn it into a film. Meirelles was initially reluctant because he knew the book "was about the beginnings of drug dealing in Rio de Janeiro, a violent story, without hope". However, partway through, he began to underline sentences and make notes on possible filming locations. Meirelles decided he wanted unknown actors and auditioned 2000 youngsters from poor areas of Rio de Janeiro. The first six months were spent improvising scenes, and the actors ended up creating about 70 percent of the dialogue.

MENTORS

BALKAN x VISEGRAD SHORT FILM NETWORK

NGO iACT, together with partners Seanema Film Festival (Montenegro) and festivals from the region, Drim Short Film Festival (Struga, North Macedonia), and Bašta Fest (Bajina Bašta, Serbia) founded the BALKAN SHORT FILM NETWORK, aimed for the education of young filmmakers, as well as promotion of the short film in the region. The project is supported for the second year now by Western Balkan Fund.

Starting this year, the project is expanding and gaining a new dimension, the BALKAN x VIŠEGRAD SHORT FILM NETWORK with the support of the Višegrad Fund (Visegrad+grant). The network is expanding to the countries of the Višegrad Group, through partnerships with short film festivals Short Waves Film Festival (Poland), BuSho Film Festival (Hungary) and Azyl Shorts (Slovakia). In cooperation with partner festivals, mentors from these countries will participate in three workshops in Montenegro, Serbia and North Macedonia.

All partners are gathered around the same goals: decentralization of cultural offer, raising awareness of the importance of short films as an art form, as well as networking, empowering and presenting young talents to wider audiences.

Ten participants will work on their festival strategy ("Festival Ready") workshop within the framework of Seanema Film Festival with mentors Dušan Kasalica (director and producer) and Danijela Radulović (producer). Guest mentors for the programme are Alexandra Gabrižová and Joanna Żak.



DUŠAN HASALICA

is a Montenegrin director born in 1897 in Nikšić. He graduated in Directing from the Faculty of Dramatic Arts in Cetinje, where he currently teaches as an Assistant Professor. In 2015 his short film "Biserna obala" (Pearl Coast) was awarded the Heart of Sarajevo, while "Soa" was awarded the Special Jury Award two years later, also at the Sarajevo Film Festival. He is a participant in the Berlinale Talents program and a member of Locarno Filmmakers Academy. He produced the film "Ti imaš noć" (You Have a Night) directed by Ivan Salatić, which premiered at Venice Film Festival in 2018. Dušan's first feature film, "Elegija lovora" (Elegy of the Laurel), had its world premiere at the Sarajevo Film Festival in 2021. Dušan is a member of the European Film Academy.



Danijela Radulović

is a Montenegrin producer born in 1990 in Nikšić. She graduated in Film production from Faculty of Dramatic Arts in Cetinje (MA). Since 2017, she has been working at the Film Centre of Montenegro as an advisor for film production and complementary activities. Her previous work experience includes working at the Royal Theater "Zetski Dom" as producer and public relations manager, collaborator on the project of Montenegrin Cinema presentation at the Cannes International Film Festival (2017 - 2021), editor of publication "Montenegrin Cinema" (2018 - 2022). She was a lecturer within the "Bridging Short Talks" project organized in cooperation with the Balkans Beyond Borders on the topic of film co-productions (2021), as well as within the Beldocs Academy program on the topic of virtual production and new technologies (Beldocs IDFF 2021). In 2022 she was selected for SOFA - School of Film Advancement with her project Profilmia Lab - Virtual Lab Film which aims to modernise existing film practices based on virtual production and new technologies.
