

Hawaii Childcare Costs average about:

Yearly: \$11,104

• Monthly: \$925



Services

- Provides day care for children from the ages of 6 weeks to 5 years of age.
- Pre-School available in about half of these centers.

Fees

- The costs may range between \$700-\$1000 a month.
- Some campus offer discounts to student parents.
- Student parents are given priority over others.



Location

 Most childcare facilities can be found on campus but open to the community.

· Between 7am - 5am

- Professional staff are under supervision of the director of Child Laboratory Programs.

University Childcare


Insights

- · Outdoor playtime for children.


