BALTIMORE RAIL & SAIL

3 Days - 2 Nights

The sample itinerary described below is approximately like the itinerary your group will be following during your stay with WHITE STAR TOURS. However, the exact times, days, and destinations may vary for your group.

- Day 1 A morning departure from Delaware has you traveling to Baltimore, MD. Upon arrival, you will visit the B & O Railroad Museum. The Museum possesses the oldest and most comprehensive American railroad collections in the world. Dating from the beginning of American railroading, the collection contains locomotives and rolling stock, historic buildings, and small objects that document the impact of the Baltimore & Ohio Railroad (B&O) on the growth and development of early railroading. It covers almost every aspect of an industry that left a permanent mark on the folklore and culture of America. The B & O was the first common carrier railroad and the oldest railroad in the United States. It operated from 1830 until 1987 when it was merged into the Chessie System; its lines are today controlled by CSX Transportation. After your visit, depart for Baltimore's Inner Harbor for a Watermark Sightseeing Cruise along the waterways to include many attractions of the Inner Harbor such as the iconic Domino Sugar sign, Fort McHenry, the Key Bridge, Fell's Point, Under Armour and more. After the cruise, enjoy free time at Inner Harbor where you can enjoy dinner on your own before departing for your hotel to check in for a two-night stay.
- Day 2 Enjoy breakfast, then board another vessel for a Day on the Bay Cruise across the Chesapeake Bay to St. Michaels on the Eastern Shore, and enjoy one complimentary non-alcoholic beverage on the way there! This quaint historic village offers fresh seafood, boutique shopping, and historic sites all within walking distance during your approximately 3 hours ashore. While in St. Michaels, you will enjoy admission to the Chesapeake Maritime Museum. The Museum offers exhibits and demonstrations that tell stories of the Chesapeake Bay and the people who have shaped their lives around it. The museum's 18-acre waterfront campus includes Navy Point and once was the site of a busy complex of seafood packing houses, docks, and workboats. Today, it is the site of the nation's most complete collection of Chesapeake Bay artifacts, visual arts, and indigenous water craft. Return to Baltimore to enjoy a Crabfeast at Phillips Seafood Restaurant. Enjoy the rest of the day at your leisure.
- Day 3 Following breakfast, check out and depart for Cumberland, MD to board the *Frostburg Flyer* for a train ride on the Western Maryland Scenic Railroad. Your ride takes you through the beautiful Allegheny Mountains to Frostburg. During your ride, you will cross over creeks, streams, and bridges, travel through a 916-foot-long tunnel while enjoying stunning views of the mountains. Once you reach Frostburg, you will have 90 minutes to explore the shops and restaurants at your own pace before re-boarding the train for your return to Cumberland. Board your motorcoach to depart for home with lasting memories of your Rail & Sail trip to Baltimore and St. Michaels.
