<u>ADVANCE HEALTH CARE DIRECTIVE</u> – It is important for you to have an Advance Health Care Directive, more commonly referred to as a "living will". If you have never completed a "living will", see Donna for a form. For those who already have a "living will", you may want to review it periodically to see that it still does what you want.



<u>NEMOURS HEALTH CLINIC – provides comprehensive dental care, eye examinations, eyeglasses, hearing tests and hearing aids to those who qualify.</u> To qualify, you must be 65 years of age or older, a resident of Delaware and a United States Citizen. Income levels are \$20,600 for a single person and \$31,900 for a married couple after Medicare Part B is taken out. For more information, please contact the clinic at 651-4405.


