

<u>ADVANCE HEALTH CARE DIRECTIVE</u> – It is important for you to have an Advance Health Care Directive, more commonly referred to as a "living will". If you have never completed a "living will", see Donna for a form. For those who already have a "living will", you may want to review it periodically to see that it still does what you want.



<u>NEMOURS HEALTH CLINIC –</u> Provides comprehensive dental care, eye examinations, eyeglasses, hearing tests and hearing aids to those who qualify. To qualify, you must be 65 years of age or older, a resident of Delaware and a United States Citizen. Income levels are \$20,600 for a single person and \$31,900 for a married couple after Medicare Part B is taken out. For more information, please contact the clinic at 651-4405.



<u>CAREGIVER RESOURCE CENTER</u> – The Howard Weston Senior Center is a "Caregiver Resource Center" site location. If you are a caregiver and in need of information on services available to you, please feel free to visit our display in the lobby by the fireplace.



<u>DMOST</u> provides a single document that functions as an actionable medical order and transitions with a patient through all health care settings in order that their wishes for life-sustaining treatment and CPR will be clearly indicated. The Delaware Medical Orders for Scope of Treatment (DMOST) program is designed to improve the quality of care people receive at the end of life by translating patient/resident goals and preferences into medical orders.
