

# TOP DOG FIREWORKS FAQ

Below are some Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) pertaining to the fireworks fundraiser. Please refer to this document prior to contacting a director or board member.

## **How do I earn a ticket to be entered into the drawing at the end of Fireworks season?**

Every shift worked earns each student and adult one (1) raffle ticket, with the exception of TMHS Students outside of the RBB organization who are working towards service hours only (NHS, Key Club, StuCo, etc.) During certain peak days (such as New Year's Eve and July 4<sup>th</sup>), tickets may be doubled for shifts worked; that will be communicated accordingly.

## **What are Band Bucks?**

Band Bucks are a new incentive program being rolled out for the Winter 2020 Fireworks selling season. Band bucks are essentially dollars that can be used as a form of payment for ANY RBB Related expenses, such as registration fees, spring trips, etc. Band Bucks can be rolled over to be used up through your Senior year and do not expire!\*

*\*Whoever is indicated in the student column on fireworks sign-in sheet is who the award will go towards. If an older sibling lists younger sibling because the older sibling is a Senior and would like to donate their Band Bucks to sibling, they would list the sibling name\**

## **What if I have a Senior who earns Band Bucks and they are not used?**

For Seniors ONLY, Band Bucks can be converted into scholarship dollars to be used towards any college or post-graduation expenses.

## **What if I earned a free Banquet ticket last year? What happens since we did not have a Band Banquet in 2020?**

IF we are able to hold a band banquet in 2021 (fingers crossed), you will still receive your free banquet ticket. If for some reason a banquet cannot be held, your ticket will be converted to \$25 Band Bucks.

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**What does my student earn for working a Fireworks shift?**

Each RBB student may earn 1 jacket point OR service hours per shift. As previously mentioned, during certain peak holiday hours (such as New Year’s Eve and July 4<sup>th</sup>), double points or hours may be offered for these shifts.

**Is there a max number of shifts my student may work?**

- There are “Student worker” shifts (15 and younger) that may work a max of 2 shifts, until otherwise communicated by Band Director or Volunteer Director. These shifts are for Greeters, Cart Wranglers and Inventory.
- There are “Sales and Sacker” shifts (16 and older) that can work as many shifts as they’d like. There are no limitations at this time.
