## Create Successful Watercolor Paintings Class Materials List

- Paper: $1 / 2$ sheets ( $15 \times 22$ ) AND $1 / 8$ th ( $5.5 \times 15$ ). Some have asked if they can use a $1 / 4$ sheet instead of a half sheet...feel free to use what you want but I encourage you to use the $1 / 2$ as it will allow you to be looser and use a bigger brush for most of it.
- Backing board: Roughly an inch greater than the watercolor paper.
- Sponge: To remove excess water from your brush. This is the best way to control the amount of paint to apply to the paper.
- Paints: Please use moist paint as the techniques we will be using in the class won't be able to be completed with dry paint.
- Brushes: Your usual arsenal of brushes and be sure to include your biggest brushes. We will be using the biggest watercolor brush you have.
- Markers: I will be demonstrating a marker value sketch before painting, so I would recommend getting a sketchbook if you don't have one. I use Chartpak gray scale markers: (Get a \#3 and \#6 but stay all French, all Warm or all Cool Gray)
- \#3 French, Warm or Cool Gray
- \#6 French, Warm or Cool Gray
- Extra Fine Sharpie Marker
- Broad tip Sharpie Marker
- Other materials:
- Pencil and Erasers
- Sketchbook
- Straight edge
- Masking fluid
- Masking tape (2" wide)
