Create Successful Watercolor Paintings Class Materials List

- <u>Paper:</u> 1/2 sheets (15x22) AND 1/8th (5.5x15). Some have asked if they can use a 1/4 sheet instead of a half sheet...feel free to use what you want but I encourage you to use the 1/2 as it will allow you to be looser and use a bigger brush for most of it.
- **<u>Backing board</u>**: Roughly an inch greater than the watercolor paper.
- Sponge: To remove excess water from your brush. This is the best way to control the amount of paint to apply to the paper.
- <u>Paints</u>: Please use moist paint as the techniques we will be using in the class won't be able to be completed with dry paint.
- <u>Brushes:</u> Your usual arsenal of brushes and be sure to include your biggest brushes.
 We will be using the biggest watercolor brush you have.
- <u>Markers:</u> I will be demonstrating a marker value sketch before painting, so I would recommend getting a sketchbook if you don't have one. I use Chartpak gray scale markers: (Get a #3 and #6 but stay all French, all Warm or all Cool Gray)
 - #3 French, Warm or Cool Gray
 - o #6 French, Warm or Cool Gray
 - o Extra Fine Sharpie Marker
 - o Broad tip Sharpie Marker

Other materials:

- Pencil and Erasers
- Sketchbook
- Straight edge
- Masking fluid
- Masking tape (2" wide)
