On Holy Saturday, the day between Good Friday and Easter Sunday, one of the things I do to get the Sanctuary ready for Easter service is to remove the prayers from the Prayer Cross and turn it around so it can be filled with carnations. This cross is up for the entire season of Lent, and everyone is invited to write prayer concerns on small pieces of paper and place them on the nails on the cross. It is a symbolic tradition here at Community Presbyterian. Above are the anonymous prayers from this year.

Prayer is one of the things that binds us together as a congregation. In worship we sing together, we participate in congregational prayer together in the Call to Worship and the Prayer of Confession. We listen to the Scriptures being read, after first calling upon God's Holy Spirit to draw near to provide for us what we need to hear in the message for the day.

Things then move from the corporate to the personal and individual. We take the offering, which is an individual expression and response to the work that God is doing in our lives.

Finally, we move into a space where we simply pray together. We open up, sometimes with a faint trickle and others with a torrent. We share with our sisters and brothers in Christ the things that bring us joy, hesitancy, sort, and despair. This is the time when we can especially feel like a congregation, a unique and particular congregation as a part of the larger Church of Jesus Christ. It is beautiful, heartwarming, tragic, and bonding. Young and old alike voice what is on their hearts; we all listen, hear, and respond as we grow closer and closer as a people of God.

Pastor's Pages continued

We remember and acknowledge that God “hears” all prayers whether voiced or internal, and that God yearns to hear what we are feeling. We close by joining together in the Lord’s Prayer, which was Jesus’ response to the first disciples who sometimes struggled with what to say and how to say it in prayer. It is truly a beautiful way to wrap up our time of worship together.

I really cherish those moments towards the end of worship. Sometimes it goes slowly and sometimes it seems to go on and on in a timeless space of communion together and with our God.

Just some thoughts to share with you all on prayer as I take down the annual Lenten prayer cross. I’ll see you Sunday, if not before.

From: Your Stewardship & Finance Council

If you've missed hearing about or reading the request to help pay for basement windows, here it is:

Who are we here at CPC?

Our faith is challenged but firm. Our community is strong. Our joys and our sorrows are shared. Our aging congregants are valued, and our youngest are treasured. Our doors are open.

But our basement windows are rotten. Literally rotten.

Our basement is used for many things by many groups. Most importantly, the basement houses our Christian Ed classes and activities. Countless children have heard Bible stories and been given Christian roots in our basement, and our intent is to ensure that many more do as well.

To use the basement to its full capacity, replacing 10 broken windows and rotting frames with new, functional Pella windows is a necessary project, and the Session is committed to having it done. The total cost of this effort is estimated at \$11,400.

If you can help cover the cost of these windows by making a special contribution, it would be a **big** help. Make a note on the memo line of your check or on your online donation page that this donation is for the window fund.

The General Assembly Mission team shared the results of 2024 special offerings this past month. Our congregation's giving was up over 2023 by a significant amount in the two special offerings we take — over \$2000 increase in Christmas Joy and over \$1000 in One Great Hour of Sharing. Together with other congregations, we **do** make a difference in others' lives.

Please don't forget to order Scrip gift cards for groceries and many, many other needs. As always, ask, Nancy Case, Ann Marie or any of our council members if you have questions.

June 1 is craft fair, June 8 is councils and the 15th is our Sunday School picnic then we are in Peach Mode. As you can see, we've run out of Sundays. CHURCH LIFE

Refresher on our Scrip Program and how it works.

You get the full value of the card and CPC will get a percentage on each card. Percentages vary by retailer.

When we purchase gift cards, the merchant makes a percentage donation back to the church. There are many, many retail outlets of all types in the Scrip program, but the one most commonly used by CPCers is Shop Rite. There are copies of the list of Participating Retail Stores and scrip order forms available on the table in Fellowship Center.

It's a simple process to order:

1. Decide how much you want in a variety of retailer gift cards.
2. Make a check out to *CPC - PW* for that amount. In the memo line, identify that it's for Scrip.
3. Drop the check off in the office (we ask for payment before we order your cards.)
4. The office will email or call you when the gift cards arrive, usually later in the week Thursdays most times).
5. Pick your cards up (full value of the check you wrote) and use them for gifts, to pay for groceries or for meals if you order restaurant gift cards, for shopping i.e. Kohls, Old Navy etc..

Shop Rite donates 4% of the total gift card purchase to CPC. So, for every \$100 you purchase in Shop Rite gift cards, CPC receives \$4. It's an easy process, it makes shopping easier and it's a great way to contribute to CPC with **NO** out of pocket expense!

SCRIP NEWS ~ In April we had 16 families purchase scrip with a net rebate of \$305.35 for CPC with a year-to-date total of \$1,185.19. Thank you everyone, and a special welcome to our new participants! Joan Stephens won this month's donated gift card. Orders are placed on the second Sunday of the month, but individual orders/ payments can be dropped off in the office prior to that if it's more convenient. 
