## From Your Pastor . . .

People are often surprised to hear that our congregation here at the Community Presbyterian Church of Chester is very busy during the Summer. "Churches are usually very quiet during the Summer, aren't they?" Ha! Summer is a time of doing different things, but doing nevertheless.

Some people try to do it all, and that is a sure way to an early grave, or at least a nervous breakdown. A Summer of opportunity means that there is something for everyone to try, not everything for someone to try.

The Scriptures, especially those following Eastertide, speak so much of God's calling, changing, challenging, equipping, and sending. It is no secret that all churches have challenges to meet, but I am very grateful that we have so much opportunity. Opportunity to "do", but also opportunity to learn. We have experienced people to teach and to pass along and we have young people to learn and to become those experienced people of the next generation.

Teaching takes courage and patience and a willingness to let go; learning takes courage and patience and the willingness to accept. Changes are inevitable in the midst of all of this as new ideas and new ways of thinking come about, but that's ok. New ideas and new ways of doing things can be scary, but they can also be very good. Old ideas can also be very good and they became old ideas because they worked and stood the test of time.

One of my favorite lessons about old/new ideas has to do with a problem that NASA confronted when we started our space program; pens don't work in zero gravity. They don't even work upside down, you know this if you have ever tried to write while lying down; it can be frustrating. So, with much research and great expense, the "space pen" was created that used pressurized ink cartridges to force the ink to the point of the pen. After a million dollars of research and development we could write in space! The Soviet space program solved this problem by using pencils.

We have many things to do this Summer that contribute to the missions of this congregation and Christ's Church. You might have written some of them off (did you get the reference to the previous example?) But my continuing prayer for all of us, myself included, is that we are given the courage to try new things and to try old things. Try something that you have never thought of trying this Summer. Peel some peaches, make some ice-cream, help with VBS, work the Bluegrass Festival, commit to going on the missions trip next Summer, try something different in addition to what is in your comfort zone. God will be with you, and God's people will welcome you and usher you along each step of a new way!

Jesus chose many different types of disciples, and one of them is you, embrace that this Summer. The opportunities are waiting, all you have to do is show up!








## **WORSHIP** ~ Music
