FROM PASTOR CHRIS



Easter Sunday begins the traditional liturgical season of Eastertide that lasts until Pentecost on May 31st. It is disappointing that we will not be able to celebrate this most holy of days in person together in our sanctuary. It makes me wonder about the long history of our congregation, since 1751, and what other Easters or other holidays, have been missed and why.

I know during the American Revolution, church did not meet for awhile, which is understandable. Also, our very first pastor, Rev Samuel Harker, ended up being removed by the denomination as a heretic! It was deemed, after some investigation, that "his teachings drifted out of the bounds of Reformed theology". Rev. Harker's creative solution to the situation was to volunteer as a chaplain for the Continental Army for a few years to avoid proceedings by the Presbytery.

Also of note, that our second pastor, Rev William Woodhull, was the first cousin to Abraham Woodhull of "Culper ring" fame and portrayed as the main character in the series "Turn, Washington's Spies". It was excellent BTW and I would suggest you watch it during our time of isolation. Rev. Woodhull was apparently an ardent patriot and spoke against the Crown from the pulpit. Anyway, I digress. But this is a time of digressions being kind of useful.

Back to Easter 2020, which is safe to say, an interesting bit to add to our long history.

We will have an Easter service recorded this coming Sunday by 10am so please plan to listen in and celebrate together with us, even though we are physically apart.

Since we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord, Jesus Christ every Sunday, and since we are in a singularly unusual time, we plan on celebrating Easter again once we can safely meet in person in the sanctuary!

So look forward to "**Second Easter**" which will begin with the Easter Sunrise service at Alstede's Farm, an Easter breakfast back at CPC, Second Easter worship in the sanctuary, and then an Easter egg hunt for the kids!

As Farmer Kurt Alstede mentioned, "We will all need something to celebrate when this is over", and celebrate we will!

So be well, stay safe, remain socially connected while remaining physically distant, and make a point about connecting with your Church, all it takes is a click!

We are collecting:

- CD's/DVD's: In appropriate cases, no burned copies or loose discs.
- Bicycles: Must have all working functional parts, no flat tires.
- Toys: Soft or Hard Toys, below 14 inches
- Linens: Bedsheets, Blankets, Curtains
- Clothing and Shoes: Men's, Women's, Children's, Infants
- Accessories: Belts, Purses, Backpacks, Hats

Not Acceptable Items:

-Books, Board Games, Puzzles, Large Toys (above 14 inches in size)
